
Mayor Hansel Proclaims DAR National Family Literacy Day In Keene

New Hampshire Newspaper Publisher Convicted

Community newspaper publisher Debra Paul faces jail time after being convicted on five class A misdemeanor counts that she used the wrong disclaimer language on political advertising.

Paul, 64, was found guilty Thursday in a verdict issued by Derry District Court Judge Kerry Steckowych. The case was tried last month in a bench trial. Steckowych found Paul guilty on five of the six counts by the state.

Paul is now due back in court on December 20 for a sentencing hearing.

According to prosecutors, Paul repeatedly broke the law when publishing ads for local political candidates and warrant articles in the *Londonderry Times* and the *Nutfield News*. The *Nutfield News* has since ceased publication.

Tony Naro, Paul's attorney, said during the trial that his client never meant to break the law, and she made repeated efforts to follow the instructions she got from the New Hampshire Attorney General's Office.

"Her intent is abundantly clear. Her intent was to comply with the law," Naro said in his closing

Paul's failure to follow the law completely is due to her faulty understanding, and not an attempt to subvert democracy, Naro said.

argued at trial that ignorance of the law is no excuse,

especially when Paul can't exactly claim ignorance. Paul's political ads were the subject of multiple reports to the New Hampshire Attorney General's Office for years. She got warning letters in 2019 and 2021 about the way she was publishing ads, and the 2021 letter informed her that if she broke the law again she could face prosecution.

According to testimony, Paul struggled to handle the ads in early 2022. Paul operated the two newspapers with one employee, her husband Chris Paul. The mistakes she made during the runup to the 2022 municipal elections were not intentional, Naro said.

Every advertisement used by the prosecution to bring the charges is clearly a political ad for school board candidates, town council candidates, and warrant articles, according to Naro. Paul's crime is that she did not make sure to have the words "paid political advertisement" in each ad that she printed. Many of the ads are labeled as being a "paid advertisement," or an "advertisement."

Each charge against Paul carries up to a year in jail and a maximum \$2,000 fine.





Holiday Appetizers And Finger Foods

Now is a popular time of year to invite guests into your home, whether for an intimate dinner, an or finger food party is a practical way to entertain, particularly during the holiday season. Just follow a few guidelines to make your party easy and fun. Keep appetizers easy to eat, generally no more than a mouthful. Serve hot appetizers on large platters (on warming trays if available), and dips in pretty bowls on large platters surrounded by crackers or crudités. Make as many appetizers in advance as possible and freeze them. Provide plenty of space around your table or tables for guests to mingle while they eat. Set out lots of napkins and medium-sized plates for food. Above all, enjoy yourself!



Holiday Cheese

A few ingredients combined and shaped into a holiday shape – a tree, a star, a bell, or even put into a martini glass, make this a festive party spread. 4 oz. salami, cut in 1/2-inch cubes Makes 14-16 servings.

Ingredients:

- 2 (8 oz.) packages cream cheese, room temperature
- 4 tablespoons butter, softened
- a small wedge of blue cheese, to taste
- 1/2 cup green olives with pimento, chopped 3 tablespoons milk

chopped parsley

chopped walnuts, pecans or sliced almonds

Mix the cheese and butter together until soft and fluffy – use a mixer, food processor or wooden spoon and make sure it is smooth. Add blue cheese and blend. Stir in milk and then the olives. Using your hands, shape the cheese into a tree or other desired shape, or a log. Press parsley and nuts into the shape and chill well. Serve with sliced vegetables and/or crackers.

Fried Artichokes

An unusual appetizer that is simply delicious. I used frozen artichoke hearts, thawed and drained, when making this recipe. Makes six to eight servings. **Ingredients:**

1½ cups flour

- 1 (12 oz.) bottle beer
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 (12 oz.) jars marinated artichoke quarters or 1/4 cup flour equivalent amount of frozen artichokes vegetable oil for frying

salt and lemon wedges for serving

In a bowl, whisk flour with beer and salt; set batter aside. Drain the marinated artichoke heart quarters and pat dry. Dredge artichoke hearts in flour, then dip in the batter. Working in batches, fry in two inches of 350 degree vegetable oil until crisp and golden, four to five minutes. Drain on paper towels; keep warm in low oven until all have been fried. Season with more salt as desired and serve warm with lemon wedges.

Crispy Baked Chicken Wings

"Wings" seem to be the finger food favored by all. This simple batch is tossed with butter and seasonings, then baked in the oven. About six to eight servings.

Ingredients:

- 3 lbs. chicken wings, separated at joint and tips discarded
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon each garlic powder, smoked paprika, black pepper and kosher salt

1 teaspoon chili powder, optional

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Toss chicken wings with butter and seasonings. Spread seasoned wings on a foil-lined baking tray(s). Bake for 40 to 50 minutes, turning several times. For extra crispy wings, once cooked turn oven off and leave wings in oven for 30 to 45 minutes more.

These bacon, green onion and parsley (subbed informal brunch or a finger food party. An appetizer for lettuce) and tomato appetizers add a nice splash of color as well as flavor to the party table. Makes about 20.

Ingredients:

20 cherry tomatoes, bite sized

1 lb. cooked and crumbled sliced bacon

1/2 cup mayonnaise

1/3 cup scallions, white and most of green, chopped 3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

2 tablespoons snipped parsley

Cut a thin slice off tomato tops. Scoop out and discard pulp; invert tomatoes on paper towels to drain. In a bowl, combine the cooked, crumbled bacon, mayonnaise, scallions cheese and parsley. Spoon mixture into tomatoes. Let sit in refrigerator several hours to develop flavors.

Hot Muffuletta Dip

The muffuletta is a type of round Sicilian sesame bread and a popular sandwich that originated among Italian immigrants in New Orleans, LA. Enjoy some of its tasty flavors in this hot dip at your next party. Makes about 12 servings.

Ingredients:

8 oz. package cream cheese, room temperature

4 oz. provolone cheese, coarsely shredded

6 oz. jar pitted green olives

1/2 cup roasted red peppers from a jar 1/2 cup Giardiniera from a jar

1 clove garlic minced

1/4 teaspoon hot sauce of choice parsley, coarsely chopped for topping

toasted bread slices for serving

Spread cream cheese into the bottom of a nine-inch pie plate. Top with shredded provolone and salami cubes; set aside. Drain and chop the jarred green olives, roasted red peppers and Giardiniera. Add to the pie plate, along with the minced garlic and hot sauce; stir lightly with a fork to combine a bit, then chill until about 1 hour before needed. Bring to room temperature for 30 minutes. Then bake dip mixture in preĥeated 350-degree oven for 30 minutes; sprinkle top with parsley. Serve warm with toasted bread slices or crackers if preferred.

Cheddar-Sausage Balls

Pile these onto a platter and serve warm, with toothpicks and your favorite BBQ or other dipping sauce, as desired. Makes about 21/2 dozen.

Ingredients:

1 lb. each lean pork sausage and grated extra sharp cheddar cheese

1 tablespoon minced sage

1 teaspoon kosher salt and 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper

1 egg, lightly beaten

Heat oven to 375 degrees. In large bowl, mix all ingredients together with a fork. Form the mixture into two-inch balls. Arrange balls two inches apart on parchment paper-lined baking sheets and bake until golden brown about 30 minutes. Transfer to platter and serve warm.

and feast with family and friends as a celebration of life. This December, that wish has become more fervent than ever. We are witnessing suffering on our TV screens and in American neighborhoods that is so shocking and harsh, that heartache and outrage seem the only possible response. Hope can feel beyond reach, especially when so many events involve children. We want to think we can protect children from all harm, and it is unbearable to think that we cannot.

Often in the last few decades, when events arise that overwhelm us, a poem by American poet, Naomi Shihab Nye, surfaces in newspapers, on social media sites, and then gets passed around among friends. She tells us, "Before you know kindness as the deepest thing inside/ you must know sorrow as the other deepest thing." At this time of deep sorrow, kindness becomes more important than ever. When outrage has the upper hand, without being tempered by compassion, we see actions that are threatening and polemic, leading to violence based on a dehumanization of anyone perceived as other.

Anti-semitism is on the rise, as well as Antimuslim attacks. There is name-calling on college campuses and in town squares. People on the fringe feel they have the right to attack and kill, and they have.

Can kindness really be an antidote to such barbaric actions? Where do we look for hope in times like these?

Meditation teacher, Sharon Salzberg, has taken a deep look into kindness and what it has to offer. She says, "Sometimes we think that to develop an open heart, to be truly loving and compassionate, means that we need to be passive... Yet this is not what is meant by compassion. Compassion is not at all weak. It is the strength that arises out of seeing the true nature of suffering in the world. Compassion allows us to bear witness to that suffering, whether it is in ourselves or others, without fear; it allows us to name injustice without hesitation, and to act strongly, with all the skill at our disposal."

In mindfulness practice, there is a lovingkindness meditation that is intended to open the heart to those we love, to ourselves, to our local as well as our worldwide community, and finally to those

Peace on Earth. We repeat this wish all throughout in life we find difficult and hard to empathize with. the season as we light candles, sing songs of hope, In times of great distress, it is even more imperative to find a way to discover our human capacity to face pain – our own and others' – and remain in touch with our desire to end suffering when we see it. Perhaps one of the most difficult things to do as an adult is to keep two seemingly opposing feelings in mind at the same time. Can we be outraged and open-hearted at the same time? Don't we all have both feelings in this time of confusion and misunderstanding?



According to historian, Howard Zinn, "To be hopeful in bad times is based on the fact that human history is not only of cruelty, but also of compassion, sacrifice, courage, kindness. If we see only the worst, it destroys our capacity to do something. If we remember those times and places where people have behaved magnificently, this gives us the energy to act. And if we do act, in however small a way, we don't have to wait for some grand utopian future. The future is an infinite succession of presents, and to live now as we think human beings should live, in defiance of all that is bad around us, is itself a marvelous victory.'

In this special time of year, there are people holding peace in mind. Some are leaders. Some are our neighbors and friends. We can choose to seek them out and join them.


