












Looking Back, Looking Ahead



Books To Help You Cook Up **Something Delicious This Winter**



The smells coming from the kitchen are making your mouth water.

You'll pull things out of the oven soon, and then you'll begin collecting compliments. It's a great time to entertain, so look for these great food books and cookbooks to enhance a splashy party, simple meal, or big feast...

When you're trying to add zing to a recipe in an easy way, you might reach for a staple in your fridge and start chopping. In The Core of an Onion by Mark Kurlansky (Bloomsbury, \$28), you'll see how that small vegetable went from garden plot to mandatory ingredient in the kitchen - but the onion isn't just a food, as you'll read. It's a tradition, a science, and a secret that many chefs use to create their favorite dishes. Like many of Kurlansky's other books, this one focuses on one single item on your plate. That, and the accompanying recipes will make you hungry.

If you always start your guests off with appetizers and you want to keep things simple, look for Madame Fromage's Adventures in Cheese by Tenaya Darlington (Workman, \$30). Here, you'll become a cheese expert in short order. Learn how cheese is made and why it's important to know. Move on to the verbiage, how to tell your cheeses apart, what to include when building the perfect cheese board, what wine goes best with which cheese, and

unusual ways to use cheese in your kitchen. This is a fun book to read, and you can put its lessons to work tonight.

For the cook who isn't into fancy kitchen frou-frou, The Secret of Cooking by Bee Wilson (Norton, \$40) is absolutely a book to have on a shelf near your stove. Part cooking lesson, part tips and hints, and part recipes, it's great for the kitchen newbie as well as for the experienced cook who knows how all the tools work. Wilson writes plainly here, with simple

directions and recipes that can be challenging but are mostly uncomplicated (although some of the ingredients may need explaining). A nice bonus is the chapter on cooking for one.

This is a pretty book and even if you don't like to cook, you'll enjoy reading it. It might even make some converts.

Finally, if you've got a kiddo in the kitchen, or if someone you know is totally, 100 percent all-thumbs around a stove, Look and Cook Snacks: A First Book of Recipes in Pictures by Valorie Fisher (Astra Young Readers, \$19.99) may be a book to find. 

NHSaves May Yet Go Down the Drain

Imagine trying to fill a bathtub with hot water. What's the best way to do it?

You could crank up the hot water and run it into the tub faster than it runs out. Eventually the tub would fill. Or, as Amory Lovins suggested more than four decades ago, you could invest in a plug.

Lovins, who is perhaps the planet's most renowned exponent of getting more work out of every unit of energy consumed, was at Dartmouth College's Irving Institute recently to give a talk entitled "Radical Energy Efficiency, Integrative Design, and Applied Hope." Applied hope, according to Lovins, is the "pragmatic and grounded conviction that starting with hope and acting out of hope can cultivate a different kind of world."

How fortunate that Lovins did not hang around New Hampshire long enough to read the November 30th order of the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on the subject of ratepayer-funded energy efficiency. There is not a drop of hope to be found there and, indeed, the PUC's order could fairly be characterized as an exercise in applied cynicism.

Yes, the PUC is allowing the three-year, \$254 million energy efficiency plan proposed by the state's electric and gas utilities to go into effect as proposed. Yes, that

means \$30 million more for the NHSaves programs than we are spending in the current triennium, which ends on December 31st.

But if you think this means the PUC has seen the light about energy efficiency, and has abandoned its hostility, as evidenced by its order two years ago that sought to eviscerate NHSaves, you are mistaken.

The latest order, signed by PUC Chairman Daniel Goldner and PUC Commissioner Pradip Chattopadhyay, made clear they consider themselves painted into a corner, legally speaking, by the General Court.

In February 2022, the Legislature passed and the Governor signed House Bill 549, in response to the PUC's previous repudiation of NHSaves. This time, the PUC correctly concluded that it had no choice, in light of the bill, other than to okay the utilities' modest set of proposed changes to the current energy efficiency programs, including a legislatively mandated inflation adjustment.

However, Goldner and Chattopadhyay pointedly refused to approve the Triennial Plan as a whole. To drive their point home, they added: "If the applicable legal standard were interpreted differently to require the Commission's approval of the Plan based on New Hampshire's general statutory standards and policy priorities, we may have reached a different result."

May have? The November 30 order features page after page of analysis from Goldner and Chattopadhyay, setting forth their objections to the Triennial Plan's central tenets, "for the benefit of the joint utilities, interested parties, and policymakers only."

Before dissecting those objections, allow me to put on my law professor hat and sound an alarm about how misguided this is as an approach to utility regulation in general. The PUC is supposed to be an adjudicator – a specialized court, essentially.

Two years ago, the General Court spun off most of the PUC's staff and used it to create the heart of a brand new state Department of Energy. The Department is supposed to be the policy oracle and the PUC is supposed to decide cases.

Courts do not issue advisory opinions. Under the utility regulation rubric adopted in New Hampshire in 2021, neither should the PUC.

The kind of "raised eyebrow" regulation reflected in such an advisory opinion is problematic for two related reasons. Utilities, including the ones that deliver the NHSaves programs, don't want to be at odds with their regulator and are thus likely to follow the agency's advice. But because the advice isn't legally binding, it is beyond scrutiny.

In other words, nobody can pursue an appeal of the November 30 order to the New Hampshire Supreme Court. Unlike our PUC, that tribunal is disciplined and steadfast in refusing to issue advisory opinions about existing law.

As for what Goldner and Chattopadhyay dislike about the Triennial Plan they declined to approve, it's mainly about how the benefits of ratepayer-funded energy efficiency are calculated and then compared to costs.

At the heart of their objection lies the Granite State Test, developed by a stakeholder group in 2019 operating under the aegis of a PUC with different commissioners than we have today. The idea was to tailor the assessment of energy efficiency's benefits to the specific conditions and public policy of New Hampshire.

The PUC ridiculed the Granite State Test two years ago, only to be explicitly overridden by the General Court in 2022. The agency's focus now is on the discount rate at the heart of the test.

Fellow ratepayers: Write off the phrase "discount rate" as arcane economics minutia at your peril. The question is how to value future benefits, such as 30 years of energy savings from a home weatherization project, to compare them fairly to costs – particularly those costs supported by all ratepayers via NHSaves.

The PUC's order dives deep into how - and at what point in time – the utilities apply the prime rate, and the inflation rate, to figure out how much to discount future energy savings. This obscures a fundamental reality: the choice of a discount rate in this context is entirely subjective.

If you like ratepayer-funded energy efficiency, you apply a low discount rate. If you are skeptical, you apply a high one that makes most ratepayer-funded energy efficiency look too expensive to justify.

Were the utilities themselves investing in energy efficiency, recourse to elaborate economic analysis would be appropriate. But this is all ratepayer money;

Food Emancipation Proclamation

Joel Salatin, author and farmer, at the First Annual Liberty Food Fest in Vermont. He had a lot of interesting things to say. Joel has a beautiful farm, Polyface Farm, in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley. When his bigger, that is not a level playing field. father bought the farm, it was rocky, unkempt and unproductive. Now, through decades of tender, loving care, it is a highly successful meat farm selling beef, pork, chicken, and eggs.



Mr. Salatin is not like traditional farmers. He doesn't use pesticides, herbicides, or other additives that conventional farms employ. He's figured out how to reclaim the land using the rotation of animals and following nature's template. He moves his cows to a new pasture or "fresh salad green area" every day. Then he waits four days before he lets the chickens in. The flies lay their eggs in the cow poop and the larvae gets developed in this amount of time. The chickens come in and peck the poop into small bits of fertilizer looking for the insects.

He also maintains that the animals should be left to be what they were intended to be. Cows are herbivores – they eat plants, mostly grasses. It is beyond his belief that the US Department of Agriculture encouraged farmers to feed them dead cow parts (the source of Mad Cow Disease), which they did.

Mr. Salatin believes that the source of this misguided information began in the early 20th century. At that time, there were seven corporations that were mostly responsible for the meat eating in the US. When Sinclair Lewis wrote The Jungle describing the horrific and dirty conditions in meat packing plants, the sales of these seven corporations went down 50 percent. The owners of these corporations panicked and flocked to Franklin Delano Roosevelt for assistance. Thus began the Federal Safety and Inspection Service. This service can be bought off by powerful interests in order to make competition from the small, independent farmers extremely difficult.

If a person wants to make doughnuts or cakes to sell to his or her neighbors, it is illegal unless they own a commercial kitchen. If Mr. Salatin wants to process his own cows, not only does he need a special barn, but it has to contain a completely separate bathroom

the utilities do not invest a dime in energy efficiency. So, here we are talking about a so-called social discount rate - basically, how we, collectively as a society, value future benefits.

What is the community's tolerance for delayed gratification? Nobody - certainly not the Public Utilities Commission – can say for sure.

This specific conversation now moves to the State House. Representative Michael Harrington (R-Strafford) is introducing House Bill 1036, which would eliminate the requirement to use the Granite State Test.

To the extent the PUC's order is properly regarded as an elaborate letter to the Legislature, take note that the missive contains the signature of just two of the Commission's three members. The third, Carlton Simpson, dissented.

Dissents by PUC commissioners are rare and this one is emphatically worded. Simpson, the only attorney on the PUC, castigated his colleagues for refusing to approve the three-year energy efficiency plan and declared: "I fear that the majority decision creates uncertainty and sends the wrong message to the parties and the public."

Simpson is right about this being the wrong message. The foes of NHSaves, both on and off the PUC, are determined to pull the plug and let the benefits of energy efficiency go right down the drain.



A short while ago, I had the pleasure of meeting only for the inspectors. That is the actual law. This isn't a problem for multi-million dollar businesses, but for the small farmer, it is impossible. Any time that a regulation is easier to comply with if you are

We need to think of a new way of doing things. When we give our power of choice to "regulators," we are opting out of our ability to make good choices based on our own research and knowledge. Most of the large meat processing plants are surrounded by fences with "no admittance" signs. Why do you think that is?

If we purchase our meat and vegetables from local farmers, we can ask to look around the place. Is it clean? Are the animals well cared for? Are the people that work there happy to do so? Also, if a number of people become ill from eating at a particular local restaurant or bakery, that business will be out of business shortly.

It's time for a Food Emancipation Act. We need to take back the responsibility for our own health and well-being.

An Egg-citing Start To A New Year

Eggs are surrounded by more symbolism, myths, and old wives' tales than any other everyday food. And with the approach of a new year, it seems fitting to think of eggs and new life. Any way you crack them, eggs are delicious and nutritious, considered nature's most perfect foods, packed with protein and amino acids. Eggs last many weeks without spoiling.

The date on an egg carton is simply there for store inventory purposes to be sure products are moved from the shelves. But if you want to be sure your eggs are fresh you can do this old-fashioned, simple but valid test for egg freshness. Gently drop a whole uncooked egg into a salt solution (two tablespoons salt in two cups of water.) If very fresh, the egg will be full and heavy, and it will sink and tip to one side. If moderately fresh, it will remain suspended in the middle of the water in an upright position; if it bobs up to the top, it is stale. Enjoy a little armchair-travel this week with recipes from around the world.



Korean-Style Steamed Eggs

When steamed, the eggs set into a lovely silken custard. Enjoy this breakfast or lunch for one whenever you seek a comforting meal.

Ingredients:

2 large eggs

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup water, plus more for filling pot

1/2 scallion, chopped

1/4 teaspoon toasted sesame seeds

Combine the eggs, salt, and one half cup water in a heat-safe ceramic bowl, such as a ramekin. Whisk until well combined and foamy. Place the bowl in a pot. Fill the pot with hot (not boiling) water to come halfway up the sides of the bowl. Cover the pot, preferably with a clear glass lid so you can easily watch the water and eggs. Cook over low-medium heat for 12 minutes, making sure the water stays at a gentle simmer. Sprinkle the scallions and sesame seeds on top of the eggs and continue to cook for about three minutes or until the eggs are set. They should be firm but jiggly. Carefully lift the bowl from the pot and serve.

Holiday Breakfast

This French way with eggs is good any time of year, but particularly popular when you're looking for a dish that can be prepared ahead of time. Makes six to eight servings.

Ingredients: 10 large eggs

1/2 cup light cream

salt and pepper to taste

butter for cooking 12 thin slices ham

1/2 lb. grated cheese such as Monterey Jack or sharp cheddar

1 cup heavy cream

Beat eggs in a bowl with the light cream, salt and pepper. Heat butter in a small skillet; when butter is hot, fill a large kitchen spoon with egg mixture and pour into skillet – just enough for a thin omelette. Cook on each side then flip onto a plate, cover

To put it simply - there is nothing quite like an egg! with slice of ham, and roll up. Continue until 12 are completed (using more butter as needed). Pack rolls tightly into an oven-proof dish. Cover roll-ups completely with grated cheese. At this point, dish can be refrigerated to serve the next day. One-half hour before serving, pour heavy cream over the roll-ups and bake at 300 degrees until cream starts to bubble. Brown the cheese under the broiler, watching so it doesn't burn. Serve immediately.

Greek Eggs with Feta
A dish for one or two, flavor-filled with eggs, cheese, tomato, and olives.

Ingredients: 1 scallion, sliced

1 large tomato, diced

2 tablespoon white wine

4 tablespoon-size chunks feta cheese

4 green or black olives, pitted and sliced

1/4 cup tomato sauce 1 or 2 large eggs

salt and pepper to taste

Sauté scallion in some butter or oil in a medium skillet. Add diced tomato and white wine. Arrange chunks of feta cheese in the bottom of a small baking dish; sprinkle on olives and tomato sauce. Pour on scallion/tomato/wine mixture. Place dish in preheated 350 degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes. Crack one or two eggs into the bubbling casserole dish, cover with foil; bake until eggs are set as desired, eight to 10 minutes. Serve hot with toast points for dipping.

Bacon & Egg Breakfast Pizza

A popular Italian-style treat with our boys when they were growing up. You can use ham instead of bacon and vary the cheese. Serves four to six. **Ingredients:**

pastry for single-crust 9" pie

1/2 lb. bacon, cooked and crumbled

2 cups (8 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese

4 large eggs

1½ cups (12 oz.) sour cream 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

Roll pastry to fit a 12-inch pizza pan. Bake in preheated 425-degree oven for five minutes. Sprinkle bacon and cheese evenly over crust. In a bowl, beat eggs, sour cream and parsley until smooth; pour over pizza. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, or until pizza is puffy

Soft And/Or Hard-Cooked Eggs

I recently discovered several approaches to cooking soft and hard boiled eggs for various dishes that worked perfectly for from two to six large eggs each

Hard-Cooked Eggs:

and lightly browned.

Bring number of eggs desired to room temperature. Fill cooking pan with water and bring to a boil. When boiling, gently lower eggs into boiling water and reduce heat to a simmer. Simmer eggs for eight to 12 minutes, depending on whether you like them "jammy" or firm. When cooked, pour off hot water and run cold water over eggs until cool enough to handle. Then peel eggs, pat dry and refrigerate until ready to use as desired.

Soft-Cooked Eggs:

Bring 1/2 inch water to boil in medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Using tongs, place eggs in boiling water (eggs will not be submerged but will steam in water). Cover saucepan and cook eggs for six minutes. Remove cover, transfer pan to sink and place under cold running water for 30 seconds. Remove eggs from pan and serve on toast, or as desired, with salt and pepper.
