A Few Poems



Reaping The Benefit Of Circuit Riders In Our Region

you? Do you picture a 19th century minister or judge aged and is supporting the Town of Winchester as on a horse, traveling from town to remote town to preach, officiate at weddings or baptisms, or render judgments in an improvised courtroom?

Welcome to the 21st century's "Energy Circuit Riders:" a team of no-cost consultants for municipalities, schools, small businesses, and farmers in our state through a program of the non-profit Clean Energy NH (ČENH). After several years of piloting a position assisting municipalities in the North Country, CENH has now hired Energy Circuit Riders for municipalities in the Monadnock and Seacoast Regions and Sullivan County.

Circuit Riders' services for municipalities, including school districts, include assessments of "the most bang for the buck" options to make facilities and operations more energy efficient - and cost effective - whether by weatherization, equipment upgrades, clean energy installations, or electrification of vehicles and equipment. The Circuit Riders' walk municipalities through the maze of potential funding, assist with grant applications to secure funding for selected projects, and also assist in selection of qualified contractors to complete the necessary work.

Within the first few years of having an experienced staffer "riding the circuit" in the North Country, over a dozen communities there have completed energy efficiency and clean energy projects. According to CENH reports, as of 2022 "The Circuit Rider Program has helped North Country communities receive more than \$1.2 million in incentives and grants, resulting in over \$3 million dollars invested in clean

energy projects.' In 2022, John Kondos of Chesterfield was hired as the first Monadnock Energy Circuit Rider. He has helped a number of our towns assess opportunities for greater energy efficiency in their town halls, public works, fire and safety facilities, and road fleets. In collaboration with Southwest Region Planning Commission, John had previously worked on Brownfields assessments, evaluating contaminated sites for their solar potential. "Brownfields" are often undevelopable for other uses, making the solar installations an excellent and even revenue-generating opportunity. (Peterborough has had a solar installation on its old landfill since 2015, powering its wastewater treatment

What does the phrase "Circuit Rider" conjure for a very promising landfill-as-solar site. He encourit takes steps toward grant-supported clean-up of a former tannery site for a potentially very sizable solar installation.



The newest Energy Circuit Rider services available in our region are specifically to help rural small businesses and farmers access REAP grants. The Rural Energy for America Program is offered by the US Department of Agriculture, and the grants cover up to 50 percent of the cost of various energy efficiency or clean energy projects. Several businesses in the Monadnock Region have already secured REAP funding for solar projects. The Guernsey Professional Building in Peterborough, Harrisville Designs, and State Line Trucking Services in Fitzwilliam have all been awarded grants for solar installations that will dramatically reduce electrical costs for their facilities. To bring more REAP investment for other small businesses and farmers in our region, CENH Circuit Rider Gabe Chelius is available to help develop projects and assist with grant applications. Gabe builds on his experience doing this work in the North Country. Among interesting projects there is an application for solar installation on an ice cream shop in Bethlehem motivated in part by that area's frequent grid outages. (Who wants freezers full of melted ice cream?) He also helped a sporting-goods store in Errol work through its grant application for a solar-plus-battery installation, which could be a valuable community resource in the event of prolonged grid outage. Sadly, Keene is not considered rural enough to qualify for the REAP grants, but all other communities in the Monadnock Region are eligible.

The non-profit Monadnock Sustainability Hub has worked closely with Clean Energy NH (CENH), and has been excited to support CENH in its introduction of Monadnock Energy Circuit Riders. What a valuable asset to our towns, school districts, small businesses, and farmers! The Monadnock Food Co-op now offers the region's first public fast charger for Electric Vehicles and two Level 2 plugs. This project was a collaboration between the co-op, Monadnock Sustainability Hub, and ReVision Energy, and supported by VW Settlement funds, plus generous local donors through The Monadnock Local Monadnock.

Cooperatives in Our Community

Cooperatives, companies owned by their members, follow seven guiding principles, including democratic member control and concern for the community. These businesses exist to serve their members instead of faraway stockholders. Monadnock Food Co-op, a grocery store in downtown Keene owned by over 4400 community members, uses a cooperative business model. Everyone can shop at Monadnock Food Co-op. However, members receive additional benefits such as quarterly discounts, patronage refunds, and vote on who serves on the board of directors: www.monadnockfood.coop.

Monadnock Food Co-op conducts an impact assessment annually, measuring its fossil fuel use, waste reduction efforts, community contributions, and more. We'll share details from their latest assessment throughout March. Here is one update: "Recently, the store has been focusing on increasing the amount of organic waste we divert from landfills to be composted," says Sustainability Coordinator Jane Clerkin. "This has led to the overflow of our compost dumpster, which is definitely better than having it go into the trash. As a solution, we have partnered with Elm City Compost to assist Casella Waste Systems in managing our organic waste."

Corps based in our region include Badger in Gilsum and Frisky Cow Gelato in Keene.

"B Corp Certification is holistic, not exclusively focused on a single social or environmental issue," reads B Lab's website. "The process to achieve and maintain certification is rigorous and requires engaging teams and departments across your company. Recertification confirms these standards continue to be met on an ongoing basis."

Any business can complete the B Impact Assessment online and see how they rank. For a business to become a Certified B Corp, it must earn at least 80 points in the B Impact Assessment and pay a certification fee. The certified company receives a full report with recommendations from B Lab on how to boost its positive impacts.





An Extra Day – A Dream Meal

Tomorrow is Leap Year, a day when February has one extra day in order to even-out our 365 days a year calendar. When I sat down to write this column, I began to think about what I would like to eat on this extra day that comes only once every four years. I decided I'd want a meal that reminded me of a special restaurant where my husband and I had eaten in the late 1990s.

Wandering around the Hanover, NH area on a gloomy, dark and rainy night, we stumbled across the Polka Dot Diner by the railroad tracks in nearby White River Junction, VT. Just as we were about to cross the street to the diner, I spotted what I recall was a restaurant with an Italian name. "Let's try that place," I said. As we approached the well-lit restaurant I could see it was fancy - waiters wearing tuxedos and customers in fancy-dress filled the place and gave it a glamorous atmosphere. We entered and were seated at the last remaining table.

Perusing the menu, I decided on a lamb dish with something called "tamarind." Having never heard of this "spice," I decided to try it – and was pleasantly surprised by the wonderful flavor of the entree. I now know that tamarind is a fruit grown on trees in tropical climates in Asia and Africa, and is a staple in their cooking, as well as in Middle Eastern cooking.

Spoon-Tender Lamb Leg

While I don't cook roast lamb often, this recipe remains a favorite with some family members and MSN readers. Perhaps one day I'll try tamarind instead of rosemary. I like to serve this with oven-roasted or mashed potatoes and a favorite side dish.

Ingredients:

6-9 lb. leg of lamb

1 cup each sliced carrots and onions

seasonings: salt and pepper; mixed herbs of thyme, rosemary, parsley and a bay leaf

1½ cups stock or dry white wine Trim lamb leg of skin and fat and place in a roasting pan with the carrots and onions. Rub the top of the roast with some olive oil and season to taste with boiling stock or wine into the pan and cover meat four to five hours, until the meat is tender enough to

cut with a serving spoon. For gravy, add more stock to pan juices, if needed. Bring to boil and reduce five pitcher for serving. Eight to 10 servings.

Green Beans And Feta

The crumbled feta offers a nice accent to the tender-crisp green beans in this pretty side dish. It goes especially well with the lamb. Recipe serves four, so double the amounts if serving with the lamb

Ingredients 2 teaspoons olive oil, or as needed 1 red bell pepper, chopped 1 tablespoon minced garlic, or to taste salt and ground black pepper to taste 1 pound green beans, cut into 1-inch pieces 1/4 cup white wine

1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese

> Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium heat. Stir red bell pepper and garlic into hot oil; season with salt and black pepper. Cook and stir until the bell pepper is tender, five to seven minutes. Stir green beans with bell pepper. Pour white wine over the green bean mixture. Place a cover on the skillet and cook until the green beans are tender, about seven to 10 minutes. Stir the green beans and sprinkle feta cheese over the mixture. Replace cover and continue cooking until the feta softens, about three minutes.

Floating Islands

This dessert my mother made on special occasions was a favorite of mine.

"Floating islands" or "Oeufs a la Neige" (snow eggs) are fluffy poached meringues in a pool of rich NH 03449. vanilla custard. This classic French dessert (also a favorite of Julia Childs") is both whimsical and delicious!

Ingredients: 3 eggs, divided 1/2 cup white sugar, divided 1/4 teaspoon salt 1½ cups whole milk 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Separate two of the eggs. (Reserve the two egg whites for the meringues). In the top of a double boiler, combine one whole egg and two yolks with 1/4 cup sugar and salt, whisking until smooth. Whisk in milk and cook over simmering water, stirring constantly with a spatula or wooden spoon. When the custard thickens enough to coat the back the salt, pepper and mixed herbs. Roast at 375 degrees of a spoon, remove it from the heat. (Do not boil. If for about 30 minutes, or until meat is browned. Pour custard should start to curdle, remove from heat and beat vigorously until smooth.) Pour the custard loosely with foil. Reduce heat to 300 degrees and bake through a strainer into a bowl and stir in vanilla. Set aside in refrigerator to cool. In a heat-proof bowl, lightly whisk reserved two egg whites with remaining quarter-cup sugar, just enough to dissolve the sugar. to 10 minutes until slightly thickened; pour into a Place the bowl on top of a pot of simmering water and stir constantly until the temperature of the whites reaches 145 degrees (63 C) or hotter. Immediately remove the bowl from the heat and use an electric mixer to beat warm egg whites until they form stiff, glossy peaks. Pour chilled custard into a serving dish. Drop meringue by heaping tablespoonfuls onto the custard to make islands. Chill before serving. Four to five servings.

Shrimp Cocktail

My Leap Day meal would begin with some shrimp cocktail made with small Maine shrimp. Unfortunately, the small pink shrimp, a winter delicacy that used to be sold from fishermen's pick-up trucks along many Maine highways and even down into New Hampshire, are no longer widely available.

The shrimping industry has been in a moratorium since 2013, largely because environmental conditions off New England are at present unfavorable for the cold waterloving shrimp. So here's my current go-to recipe for easy Shrimp Cocktail. **Ingredients:**

- 1 cup ketchup
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon prepared horseradish
- dash Worcestershire sauce

11/2 lbs. large, cooked, tail-on shrimp, chilled

Add all ingredients except shrimp to a bowl and mix well to combine. Taste and adjust to your preference (more horseradish if you want it spicier and more ketchup if you want it mellower).

The sauce can be made ahead and refrigerated for several days. Serve sauce cold with shrimp.

House Tries Again To Legalize Cannabis Use And Sales

Once again, the House gave initial approval to a bill legalizing the recreational use of marijuana that many hope will cross the "T"s and dot the "I"s to eventually make it into law.

For years, the House has passed legalization of cannabis only to see the bills die in the Senate or face a sure veto from Gov. Chris Sununu, who last year did an about face and said he would approve legalization if it was structured similarly to the state's liquor monopoly.

"It is high time we legalized marijuana in this state in a way to actually be signed into law and move forward on this," said bill sponsor Rep. Erica Layon,

The bill's restrictions and guidelines caused one of its sponsors to say he would vote against his bill.

Rep. Jonah Wheeler, D-Peterborough, said the current proposal before the House takes a bill that simply legalized recreational use and private sales and turned it into an agency store model with restricted use and sales.

"That is not a free market or a good way to legalize cannabis," Wheeler said, predicting "big cannabis will swoop in and buy up all the stores with big money for lobbyists.

He said that will force state residents to overpay for an under-quality product when they can go across the state border and buy marijuana for less money, get a better product and more choices.

He said people would continue to use the black market under the proposal before the House noting the plan is not really legalizing recreational use.

There is this hunger we feel, but this is a baloney sandwich," Wheeler said. "Let's come back when lobbyists have less control of the other side of the wall."

But Layon and others argued they tried to craft a piece of legislation which is a compromise in order to make it through the Senate and win the governor's signature.

She defended the plan saying it would eventually lead to a free market with lower prices and more choices, while being regulated and transparent.

House Commerce and Consumer Affairs Committee chair, Rep. John Hunt, R-Rindge, said the House has tried many times to legalize marijuana and this bill is the right answer for New Hampshire which already has the model with liquor stores in place.

"No state has ever walked back and made marijuana illegal again," Hunt said, "but some states may wish to do what we are doing which is to take baby steps."

The bill passed on a 239-141 vote and now goes to the House Finance Committee for review before a final vote on the bill.

Make The Most Of February's Extra Day

day to keep the calendar in sync with the solar year. February gets the extra day, having 29 days instead of the usual 28. It is fun to consider how to spend this extra day that only happens every four years.

Imagine having your birthday fall on February 29th; you would only get to celebrate on your actual birthday every four years. People who are born on February 29th are called leaplings, and there are about four to five million leaplings worldwide.



Make leap year fun by considering how to spend an extra day that's unique and different. Focus on animals who leap, have a contest to see who can find the most images of animals who leap and jump in books and magazines. Play with the idea of how these different animals move and try to leap, jump, and hop like the different animals around the room.

Set a timer for 29 minutes and see how clean you can make your home with everyone pitching in for the 29 minutes. Have a fun activity planned to celebrate your success.

Create a family time capsule to open on the next popular, take a family picture to see how much everyone changes in the next four years. Hide away the capsule somewhere and write down where you stash it so you can find it when the next leap year

Is there something you have been wanting to do, but never seem to find the time? Use this extra day to get it accomplished.

You can also let each family member select one thing they want to do together as a family that takes 29 minutes or less, and do each one at some point during this bonus day.




