



The mountain's offerings have diversified to cater to everyone, regardless of the season. Chase helped establish Westmoreland's Emergency Management Department, of which he is currently deputy director, and is an active member of the Westmoreland Town Band. He currently serves on Cheshire Health Foundation's Board of Trustees. An active outdoorsman, Chase enjoys mountain climbing, sailing and spending time with his wife of 60 years, Barbara.

Jay Kahn came to the Monadnock region 35 years ago when he was recruited as Keene State College's vice president of finance and planning. His passion for education, rural economic progress and healthcare drove his involvement in various local nonprofit organizations, including Monadnock Economic Development Corp., Greater Keene Chamber of Commerce, and Cheshire Medical Center. He was a trustee on the Medical Center's board prior to serving as its chair from 2011-13. During his tenure Cheshire began exploring integrating with Dartmouth Health. Kahn served as a New Hampshire State Senator from 2016-22. He championed many healthcare-related issues during his time in office, including improving Medicaid reimbursement rates, adjusting licensing requirements for nurses and physicians, and expanding reciprocity between states for healthcare licensure. As the chair of the Senate's Education & Workforce Committee, he was instrumental to introducing a Licensed Practical Nursing program at River Valley, a program now available at four of the seven community colleges in the state. Kahn was working on a bill to expand telehealth services prior to the COVID-19 global pandemic, an effort that combined foresight and practicality with incredible timeliness. Kahn's senate term ended in December 2022 and in November 2023 he was elected mayor of the City of Keene. He remains staunchly committed to the health and well-being of Keene and other Greater Monadnock communities

In today's information-rich era, having a search engine at our fingertips is a marvel, providing instant up to two days before it occurs. Currently, kidney answers. However, amidst this wealth of information injuries are identified after they've occurred and can be misinformation, particularly in healthcare. treatment is damage control, not prevention. There Many of us are guilty of spiraling into worst-case are unarguable benefits to these technologies. scenarios after Googling symptoms.

Thankfully we have doctors, people who do their best to guide us back when we've followed a rabbit trail. Then there are electronic medical records, which hold vital information about an individual's health. AI programs can process this data rapidly, whereas traditional healthcare often requires doctors to interpret it manually within limited appointment times. With AI handling much of the data analysis, doctors could focus more on patient care during visits, potentially reducing burnout, and enabling them to show up with the healing energy of connection and kindness, rather than the breakneck pace often required in healthcare. What if your doctor could walk into the exam room and spend more time listening to you, making eye contact, understanding your concerns? AI programs also can document visits in real-time, meaning fewer after-hours work to chart notes.

As with any new technology, there are many unknowns, many questions and not as many answers. Widespread adoption of AI raises complex questions about where to draw the line and who should set these boundaries. Maybe more importantly, who is drawing the lines?

A colleague recently said, "I've come to learn that human beings are clever, but we aren't always smart." This might apply when considering the introduction of AI, perhaps the very existence of AI for that matter. We're clever enough to invent it, but are we smart enough to manage it?

Will human roles in healthcare diminish? Automation in fields like radiology could raise concerns about the erosion of human expertise. The old "use it or lose it" adage comes to mind. Computers, while efficient, are not infallible, and errors in AI algorithms could have widespread consequences.

Additionally, the security of medical records in a digital age raises concerns about data breaches and potential ransomware attacks. How will sensitive medical data be protected? What if AI could diagnose Parkinson's based on a user's trembling while using a computer mouse? (It may very well be possible!) Would that be accessible in medical records and shared with life insurance companies resulting in higher premiums or outright denials?

Effective management of these risks requires significant investment and oversight. It's essential to address concerns about data privacy, bias, and the potential consequences of AI errors before widespread adoption.

For all the possible benefits, there might be twice as many risks. Thankfully, for most of us, for now at least, our human healthcare workers are the ones who can offer a shoulder to cry on, give hugs after a difficult appointment, and pass a box of tissues when needed. Connection and kindness are human traits and for now, ones that remain strictly human. But the future is a big place...

### **Electric Vehicles In New Hampshire**

As we continue the slow move away from fossil fuels, New Hampshire has its eye on electric vehicles. With well over 100 charging stations across the state, it seems like New Hampshire is ready for EVs to replace modern combustion and challenge the current trajectory.

But are we? Changes in overall habits happen sluggishly when the market is stable. With no concrete incentive, many are waiting for the cost of EVs to come down as the technology ages. A federal rebate of up to \$7500 is available for any US resident who purchases a hybrid or electric vehicle. No state rebate is available, but many utility companies are giving rebates up to \$1000 for an EV purchase made last year in 2023. Both used and new vehicles qualify for this rebate. Drivers are encouraged to reach out to their local utility companies and apply for the Federal rebate.



Even with EVs becoming more and more popular, it remains unclear if our state pocketbook is actually capable of supporting an influx of new vehicle types. Tax revenue from gasoline sales largely funds road construction in our state. New Hampshire is one of the states "penalizing" hybrid and electric vehicle owners for the loss of this revenue.

During registration, EV owners are being charged a fee to "offset gas revenue" for their vehicles, according to a bill signed last year in September.

Citizens who drive electric vehicles have mixed feelings about being asked to pay out of pocket as a \$50-\$100 fee for road upkeep instead of paying the gas tax. Many regard the fee as backwards and unsupportive of larger sustainability movements, but road maintenance is vital to any state. It is a difficult and complicated matter. If the state relies too much on the gas tax, drivers won't be as incentivised to buy EVs, but without the gas tax, other forms of revenue will have to be raised, somehow.

The looming burden of our dependence on fossil fuels cannot be ignored. Real solutions for addressing road damage due to climate change need to be found. Hybrid vehicles and EVs aim to challenge the status quo, but the manufacture of their batteries can tip the scales back towards environmental damage.

Our state is still 24th of 50 according to a national air quality survey. Even though we are top ranked for cleanliness and pollution mitigation, New Hampshire struggles to reach even a moderate air and water quality score.

Not all of this is due to vehicles, although our roads present unique challenges. Logging and long distance commutes contribute to the deep wear and tear on our road systems. Soft ground that freezes seasonally is always difficult to maintain, and add in our winter salt consumption and you can see why we are still at 24 of 50.

New roundabouts being installed all over the state are mitigation efforts aimed at idling traffic. It helps, but only to reduce climbing numbers. Concerns over safety are being met with the reality of Climate Change. It's clear we need multiple fronts for this effort. ### **At-Home Travel With Mardi Gras Foods**

Mardi Gras is an annual holiday traditionally celebrated with traditional Cajun and Creole influenced foods on Fat Tuesday to mark the culmination of the feasting period that falls before Christian Lent. And while that celebration ended yesterday, there's still time this week to carry on the tradition of Mardi Gras with comforting, flavor-packed traditional dishes for your own Big Easy dinner or party at home. Classic recipes like gumbo, jambalaya, shrimp creole, red beans and rice, and King Cake are all incredible dishes that'll make you feel like you're in the Louisiana bayou. Choose your own favorites or try some of this week's Mardi Gras-inspired recipes.

**Easy Shrimp Boil** A shrimp boil on the stove sounds like a lot of work, but this recipe is actually an easy one-pot dinner for four; serve along with cornbread or rice. **Ingredients:** 

- 4 quarts water
- 2 small yellow onions, halved
- 1/2 cup dry, Cajun shrimp boil seasoning (see note below)
- 1 lemon, halved, plus wedges for serving
- 1 head garlic, halved crosswise
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 8 ounces small red potatoes, halved
- 8 ounces andouille sausage, cut into 8 pieces
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pounds large unpeeled shrimp
- 2 ears fresh corn, shucked and cut into thirds (frozen corn-on-cob may be substituted)

Bring water, onions, Cajun seasoning, halved lemon, garlic, and salt to a boil in a large stockpot. Add potatoes and sausage and boil until potatoes are just tender, 18 to 20 minutes. Add shrimp and corn and cook until shrimp are opaque, about three minutes. Drain and serve on a large platter with lemon wedges. Or, for a festive occasion, cover your table in a washable tablecloth and serve straight from the surface.

Note: to make your own Cajun-style seasoning for a boil or other such-seasoned recipes: In a bowl, combine 1/4 cup each garlic and onion powder, 2 tablespoons paprika, 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper, 1 tablespoon black pepper, 1 tablespoon each dried thyme and oregano, 1 teaspoon salt and 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper. May adjust amounts according to taste.



### Mini Muffuletta Sandwiches

This recipe is great for a party and is made the day before.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup pimiento-stuffed olives, drained and chopped
- 1 can (4¼ ounces) chopped or sliced ripe olives
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons red wine vinegar
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons olive oil
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon each dried basil and oregano 6 French rolls, split
- 1/2 pound thinly sliced hard salami
- 1/4 pound sliced provolone cheese
- 1/2 pound thinly sliced Cotto salami (cooked salami)
- 1/4 pound sliced part-skim mozzarella cheese

In a large bowl, combine two kinds of olives, vinegars, olive oil, garlic, basil and oregano; set aside. Hollow out tops and bottoms of rolls, leaving threequarter-inch shells (discard removed bread or save for another use). Spread olive mixture over tops and bottoms of rolls. On roll bottoms, layer hard salami,

### **Cornbread-Oyster Stuffing** Patties

Two Southern favorites, cornbread and oysters, are combined to make a stuffing that can be used as a side dish, or fried into patties. About five cups. **Ingredients:** 

#### 6 tablespoons butter, divided

- 1 cup thinly sliced carrots
- 1 cup each diced onion and celery
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 tbsp minced fresh sage or 11/2 teaspoon dried
- 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper
- 4 cups crumbled cornbread (about 1 nine-inch skillet recipe) or purchased
- 1 pint shucked oysters, drained (save the liquid if stuffing needs added moisture)

Heat a large, heavy skillet over medium-high heat and melt two tablespoons butter. Add carrots and brown in an even laver until just tender, about five minutes. Add the onion and celery and cook for two to three minutes. Stir in chicken broth, sage, salt and pepper and bring to a boil. Lower heat and simmer for one to two minutes. Stir in remaining four tablespoons butter and let it melt. Add the oysters and cook three to four minutes, stirring gently; remove pan from heat. Place crumbled cornbread in a bowl and pour the vegetable/oyster mixture over the bread; toss well to coat. Serve the cornbread as a side dish. Or refrigerate mixture for a few hours and then form it into individual patties about two and a half to three-inch diameter. (Ådd a little oyster liquid if mixture seems too dry). Fry patties in two or three tablespoons hot oil, turning once or twice, until nicely browned on both sides.

### King Cake Monkey Bread

A can of pre-made cinnamon roll dough is the secret to this traditionally-inspired carnival season dessert. King cake is one of New Orleans' local delicacies, a coffee cake-like confection covered with white icing and sugar sprinkles. There's a trinket, usually a plastic baby, hidden inside each one as a good luck symbol. Per tradition, if you end up with the baby (or other hidden trinket) you get to be in charge of bringing the King Cake to the next Mardi Gras party. **Ingredients:** 

- 3 (17.5-oz.) cans Pillsbury cinnamon rolls grands 1 (8-oz.) pkg. regular cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 cup evaporated milk
- garnish: reserved icing and purple, yellow, green sanding sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a tube pan with cooking spray. Cut each cinnamon roll into four pieces (save icing to use later). Place cinnamon roll pieces into tube pan.

Make cream cheese mixture: beat together cream cheese and sugar. Add eggs, vanilla, and milk. Mix until combined. Pour cream cheese mixture over cinnamon rolls. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes, then let pan cool 10 minutes. Turn out to cool completely before topping with cinnamon roll icing and decorating with sanding sugar.

Note: If you chose to add a trinket (or even a pecan), don't bake it into the cake. Rather, cut a small hole in the top of the cooked, cooled cake before icing it. Insert your trinket and replace the small piece of cake removed. Then ice over the top and add the sanding sugar garnish.
