### Check Off Your Home Improvement List Polish Easter Bazaar Planned For March 23rd

Our Lady of Czestochowa in Turners Falls, MA, will be holding their Easter bazaar on Saturday, March 23rd. All are welcome to attend this Polishthemed Easter fair.

This event has recently expanded their selection with a wider variety of Polish foods to include several fruit babkas, rye breads, kielbasa, poppy seed rolls, angel wings called chrusciki, fruit-filled donuts called paczki, and bigos, which is hunters' stew.

Bigos, the national dish of Poland, combines several different types of kielbasa, ham, veal, pork, cabbage, sauerkraut, onions, mushrooms, prunes, wine and marjoram. It is slowly cooked for several hours resulting in a rich, slightly sweet blend of flavors.

The church's St. Hyacinth Pierogi Makers have been busy the past three months making and freezing three types of pierogi: cheese, sauerkraut, and potato-and-cheese. The church is well known for making what many are calling "the biggest and best pierogi" in the region.

Coffee, donuts, and homemade muffins plus free coffee will be available in the morning. At 10 a.m., a lunch menu featuring a Polish plate with kielbasa, mashed potatoes, honey nugget carrots, and Polish beet salad will be available. In addition, corn chowder, hot dogs and kielbasa dogs with sauerkraut also will be for sale. A bake sale will offer a variety of baked goods, maple syrup, honey, and several raffles, as well as arts and crafts that will be sold in the St. Teresa building.

### Consistency Is Key For Healthy Discipline

The key to effective discipline is consistency and follow-through presented in a loving and caring manner. Kids respond best when they have clear boundaries and know that the boundaries and rules help keep them safe because parents love their children and want the best for them. It takes time and discipline on the part of the parents to maintain the firmly explain what consequence you will give if they level of consistency necessary to raise well-adjusted children, and it is not an easy task.

If parents have not maintained consistent and firm boundaries starting when children are young, changing how they discipline can be especially challenging. Kids will push back when change happens, and parents may find it more difficult to keep their resolve to change how they discipline.

Research shows that physical punishment is not effective in the long run, and neither is yelling at with the established consequence if they continue the children or shaming them. The purpose of discipline unwanted behavior after you give a reminder, chilisn't to make children feel bad for what they have done, but to learn expected behaviors and understand why their actions were not appropriate. Harsh reminder to avoid the consequence. physical and verbal punishments can have lasting negative effects on children's physical and mental health over time.

Figuring out how to discipline children and The first order of business is to teach children how manage behaviors can be a truly difficult task for you expect them to behave using calm words and grace to make mistakes

Establish clear and consistent rules for your famin words that they will understand. I recommend Sometimes parents try to use positive discipline, having a few basic rules that can be used in different circumstances rather than a laundry list of things you don't want your children to do. For example, be kind with your words and bodies. This will cover all sorts of behaviors including name calling, hitting, etc.

Take time to explain the rules and expectations before having to intervene to correct negative behaviors. Make sure children are focused and listening, get down to their level, and be clear about what you expect of them.

Prepare kids before events that may require more specific expectations, such as going to visit someone else's home or going to a public event. Be clear about *University*. She works what will happen if they do not follow the expectations, and be prepared to follow through.

Kids will test the rules and forget about them at times. This is normal and to be expected. Often She also has many years they may just need a reminder, but sometimes consequences are needed. If you remind a child of the rule and they continue to break it, you can calmly and continue. For example, if you say that if they don't pick up their toys, you are going to put them away for 03431. the rest of the day – be prepared to follow through. Don't keep reminding them of the consequence, giving them multiple chances to misbehave. Part of their testing is to see how serious you are about it. If you keep giving reminders without follow through, children will not learn that you are serious.

The consequence should be age appropriate and appropriate for the behavior. If your child refuses to clean up toys when asked, you may opt to put the toys away on a shelf for the rest of the day, and tomorrow they can have another chance. If a teenager shows up

easy to be consistent all the time. You may occaand need to repair your relationship while still holding kids accountable. In my next column, I will provide some specific suggestions based on ages.

### Irish Appetizers And Party Food

If you're planning a party for almost any occasion, from traditional holidays to birthday parties, finger foods are a perfect way for everyone to relax. March 17th is St. Patrick's Day, a holiday that welcomes a full-scale family dinner or a simple celebration with shared appetizers. This week's Irish appetizers feature some traditional Irish foods and recipes, as well as a few fusion foods that combine international food ideas with Irish ingredients. I hope you'll enjoy this selection of Irish party food.



### **Reuben Bites**

These are like a good Reuben sandwich. Creamy dressing, corned beef, Swiss cheese... love 'em! Use whatever type of pickle you prefer – bread and butter, dill, and even spicy. Makes four to six servings; recipe amounts are easily increased, as desired.

Ingredients: For the dressing: 2 tbsp. mayonnaise

2 tbsp. ketchup

1 tbsp. sweet pickle relish 3/4 tsp. prepared horseradish

1/2 tsp. fresh lemon juice 1/4 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

salt and freshly ground black pepper

For the bites:

2 cup pickle chips, drained and divided 4 oz. thinly sliced corned beef

3 oz. thinly sliced Swiss cheese

1/4 c. sauerkraut, drained

Make the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together mayonnaise, ketchup, pickle relish, horseradish, lemon juice, and Worcestershire sauce; season with salt and pepper. Arrange half the pickle chips on a platter. Top with sliced corned beef, Swiss cheese, sauerkraut, and drizzle with dressing. Close the bites with remaining half of pickles and a toothpick.

### Easy Beer Bread

With only three ingredients, this is one of the easiest breads to make. After you've made and cooled the bread, serve it sliced and topped with sliced gravlax or smoked salmon pieces. Add a dab of mayonnaise mixed with some mustard, and top each appetizer with a thinly sliced cucumber, making as many as desired.

Ingredients:

3 cups of self-rising flour

12 oz. of beer (light beer will give it the mildest taste, but any beer you like will work)

1/3 cup honey

Preheat to 350 degrees. Mix all of the ingredients in a large mixing bowl with a large spatula until the dough begins to form together and begins to pull away from the side. (Dough will have a wet consistency). Pour into a greased 9×5 loaf pan. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes. Allow to cool well before slicing to use for appetizers.

### Irish Cold Spiced Beef

While this sandwich specialty takes three days to a week to marinate in the refrigerator, the actual process of preparing the dish itself takes very little time. This is lovely served on some buttered brown bread, topped with a spoonful of sweet chutney or jam. It also pairs well with potato salad and finger foods, such as celery, carrots, pickles, deviled eggs. Ingredients:

Marinade: 1½ cups vinegar; 1 cup water; 2 tablespoons kosher salt; 2 teaspoons sugar; 3 cloves minced garlic; 2 tablespoons pickling spice (tied in cheesecloth).

Combine marinade ingredients and bring to a boil; simmer 10 minutes partly covered. Cool completely. Place a 4 lb. beef bottom round or brisket in cooled marinade and refrigerate one to three days, turning occasionally with a wooden spoon.

After that time, bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer three or three and a half hours, until fork tender. Cool two hours in marinade. Place overturned saucer on top of meat and place a heavy weight on saucer (a brick or heavy can). Refrigerate in marinade three days to one week to allow the flavor to mellow.

To serve: Scrape off jellied marinade and place beef on a carving board. Cut slices against the grain, as paper-thin as you can, and serve with assorted breads. Makes 12 or more portions. This spiced beef keeps well for a week to 10 days refrigerated.

### **Irish Nachos**

This recipe for Irish Nachos is made using potato chips that are layered with plenty of cheese and toppings for a perfect party snack. Makes about eight servings.

Ingredients:

4 cups kettle style potato chips

2 cups shredded Irish cheddar cheese, or other cheddar of choice

1/2 cup cooked crumbled bacon 1/4 cup finely chopped chives

1/3 cup sour cream

1/4 cup diced tomato

hot sauce, optional

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Place the chips on a sheet pan. Sprinkle the cheese evenly over the chips, then add the bacon on top of the cheese. Bake for approximately five minutes or until cheese is melted. Top with sour cream, tomato and chives and serve immediately. If desired, drizzle on some hot sauce.

### Irish Whiskey Sliders

Small burgers simmered in a whiskey BBQ sauce, then spiced with jarred jalapeño slices, and served on slider rolls. Serve these chin-drippers with napkins! Ingredients:

2 lbs. ground beef (or bison, turkey)

salt and pepper to taste

4 tablespoons butter

1 onion, diced

1/2 cup whiskey

1 cup barbecue sauce, prepared or your own 1/4 cup jarred jalapeño slices, more or less, to taste 12 whole slider buns or dinner rolls, split

Form the meat into about 12 miniature patties; add salt and pepper both sides. Melt butter in skillet over medium-high and cook until just about done in the middle; remove and set aside. Add diced onion to pan and cook about three minutes. Pour in the whiskey, carefully (watch it doesn't burn back towards your hands) and stir; allow whiskey sauce to reduce about half, three to four minutes, then stir in jalapeño slices and BBQ sauce. Reduce heat to low and put the patties in the pan sauce, turning to coat. Allow patties to heat through. Place patties on individual buns, spoon some sauce with jalapeños over each, and top with other half of bun.

When folks think of yoga, they often think of postures, or asanas. The two words seem to have the same meaning: yoga and postures. But asana is one facet of what yoga is about. Asana is not the

Another facet is called yamas, meaning social ethics or ways of interacting with the world around us. According to Nischala Joy Devi, yamas are reflections of our true nature. Yamas are a yogi's basic principles to live by. There are five yamas.

The first one, Ahimsa, means Peace in Actions, Thoughts, and Speech. Gandhi lived his whole life following this principle. He made the word Ahimsa known around the world. Ahimsa is often translated non-violence. The UN has declared October 2nd, Gandhi's birthday, as the International day of Non-Violence. This is the first yama, and being the first is the most important way of interacting with the world. If ever in doubt about how to act, think, and talk, refer to being peaceful.



### NH Department Of Agriculture Launches Crop Loss Program, Accepting Applications

ture, Markets, and Food Commissioner Shawn N. Jasper announced that the Crop Loss Program have begun accepting applications.

The \$8 million program, developed in collaboration with staff from UNH Cooperative Extension, is designed to help New Hampshire farmers who suffered significant crop losses as a result of extreme weather conditions which negatively impacted farms during 2023.

Surveys conducted by Cooperative Extension following the inclement weather found that fruit growers lost virtually all their peach crop due to extreme low temperatures. That loss was followed by a late freeze which destroyed a significant portion of the state's apple crop. Farms then saw additional losses throughout the growing season due to an overabun-

"Last year's brutal cold snap, late freeze, and overabundance of rain took its toll on crops across the Granite State," said Governor Chris Sununu. "New Hampshire is wasting no time in ensuring our farmers receive relief to jumpstart the 2024 growing season following significant crop losses last year.

"New Hampshire's farmers do grueling work every day to provide food for Granite Staters," Jas-

Gov. Chris Sununu and Department of Agricul- per. "This program will make resources available immediately to provide producers with the resources needed to jumpstart a successful growing season."

The program will be open to any farm which suffered at least a 30 percent loss of any commodity, had a gross farm income of at least \$30,000 in the previous three years, and has neither closed nor is currently in bankruptcy. Awards will be made in a timely fashion to allow farms to purchase supplies ahead of the upcoming growing season.

Funding for the program, approved at the Executive Council Meeting on Wednesday, February 21, 2024, repurposes ARPA Funding to provide almost immediate relief to farms in need.

Applications will be reviewed weekly to expedite award of aid. All applications must be received by May 15th, at which time the total losses will be evaluated. Additional payments may be made if funding allows. In no case will any farm's payments exceed their loss, which will include a reasonable allowance for an owner operator's labor.

Farmers raise funds to cover 15 percent of the program costs and 35 percent of program costs is provided by the The Center for Population Health at Cheshire Medical Center through the Healthy Monadnock Alliance. The customer is responsible to pay 50 percent of the total share cost.

### Tips For Making Best Use Of A Storage Unit

• List the contents of each box on all four sides. Number storage boxes and create a reference guide for the easy location of items. Seal all boxes with tape.

• Wrap fragile items. Dishes, glasses, and other like items should be wrapped in paper and packed in sturdy boxes. Stack items of this nature on the top of a stack. Framed pictures and mirrors should be wrapped in cardboard and marked fragile.

 Cover stuffed furniture with cardboard or blankets to protect against dust. Refrain from stacking items on top of soft furniture as over time it will leave imprints on the furniture. Do not place heavy

or sharp objects on top of upholstered furniture.

• Mattresses may bend out of shape if not standing straight up. A mattress stored on its side should be propped up so that it does not lean. A mattress cover will help protect it from dust and dirt both in the moving and storage period.

• Furniture with drawers can be utilized as storage space for pictures, china, silverware, knick-knacks, or other small items. Wrap these items in tablecloths, towels, blankets or other fabric items being stored to help prevent breakage and save on the cost of additional packing materials.

• Pre-plan how items are arranged. Place items that need to be more readily or frequently accessed near the front and allow space for walkways through the storage unit.

• Climate-controlled storage may be best for any items that are: sensitive to heat, cold, or moisture; prone to collecting dust, mold, or mildew; or are of monetary or sentimental value.





But what about the impact of gardening on our environment? It seems until temperatures are consistently

like a no-brainer: of course gardening is good for the environment! But that is only true when the gardener works as a team with all the other living things who exist in their yard.

Creating a treeless space to enjoy the outside is a human practice dating all the way back to pre-colonial Africa. Herding livestock was considered a highly honorable position, as was the maintenance of the local turf: the food for the livestock.

Over the centuries the idea of a lawn has taken many shapes. The unadorned grassy expanse in front of the home of Thomas Jefferson was an inspiration to the rest of his compatriots. Thus the American lawn was born: where the aristocracy could have their land free of livestock or trees, a "lush" expanse of non-native grass.

In reality, nature cannot abide a vacuum, and any space left will be filled by various suitable life forms until an ecosystem is made. Monocultures are fast becoming unpopular because of their negative impact on our environment.

A monoculture is defined as an ecosystem with nearly no diversity. When we remove native flowers and turf plants, we are literally uprooting the local ecosystem. Plants need diversity to compete and the life forms that consume the plants are specially adapted to that diversity.

This year, consider the long term effects of that Brand Name grass seed before you buy it. Alternatives to nonnative or bio-engineered grass lawns are out there, usually existing right next to the brand name stuff.

ensure the beneficial insects who are hibernating can survive. Without these pollinators (not just bees), we would not have a supply of food. Creating a sustainable garden doesn't take a ton of work, but it does take a few mindset adjustments. By centering the whole environment instead of your desires, you get the chance to participate in the ecosystem, rather than destroy it.

Make no mistake, monoculture is not natural, nor is it a sustainable feature. Reducing the available food diversity, even in a small environment like your lawn, can contribute to the extinction of amazing beings like fireflies, butterflies, and even birds.

Using products that kill any single bladed plant in your yard will harm not just you in the long run. It harms us all.

Don't be discouraged if you are deep in a lawn care ritual and feel like you can't stop. This spring, choose native turf plants for your lawn. Slowly changing the biodiversity of your lawn doesn't have to come with the risk for ticks and Lyme disease. Stick to low-growing turf options and consider using natural features like rock walls and shrubs to keep animals out of your space.

I hope this information tempts you to add some of these lovely flowers to your gardens for remembering friends.


