

# A Is For Asparagus

Like 'A 'is the first letter of our alphabet, asparagus is one of the first vegetables in our local gardens and, to my mind, the first in a line of aristocratic vegetables. Asparagus is a queen, a royal treat when prepared simply, whether served with a sauce or married with pasta, various roasted vegetables, seafood or poultry.

Today there are various ways to prepare and enjoy asparagus. Wash asparagus and break off the stalk right where it bends easily to the touch; if preferred, peel the stalk with a vegetable parer rather than snapping off the tougher part. Both these methods work well for preparing asparagus to eat plain, on toast with a sauce, or in a simple casserole. You may also use asparagus in a quick stir-fry, with seafood, chicken, tofu, or other vegetables. Another favorite way to prepare asparagus is to grill or roast it in the oven, either as a stand-alone vegetable or in combination with other vegetables. With all methods, cook asparagus until just tender, about three to five minutes - don't overcook it! And when serving, keep in mind that asparagus is delicious served hot, cold, or at room temperature.

#### Asparagus with Chicken & **Peppers**

This is one of my favorite dishes as it is easily prepared and takes well to substitutions. Use broccoli instead of asparagus; use shrimp instead or chicken; use only various veggies; serve with rice or crusty bread; vary the cheese. Serves six. **Ingredients:** 

1 lb. asparagus, trimmed as desired and cut bite-sized

2 red peppers, seeded and cut in strips

1 tablespoon olive oil

salt and pepper as desired

4 chicken breast halves, boned, skinned and cut bite-sized

4-5 tablespoons butter, divided

3 tablespoons flour

1 cup chicken broth (or bone broth)

1 cup heavy cream

1/4 cup white wine (or more broth)

11/2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Put asparagus and peppers in a 13x9-inch baking dish; toss with oil, salt and pepper. Roast vegetables for eight to 10 minutes; remove and set aside. Season chicken with salt and pepper. In a skillet, add one tablespoon butter to melt. Brown the chicken lightly on all sides; add chicken to baking dish with vegetables. In the same skillet, make a sauce by mixing rest of melted butter and flour. Stir to combine and then slowly whisk in the broth, cream and wine until smooth and thickened. Stir in one cup of the cheese and pour mixture over chicken and vegetables; lightly stir. Sprinkle rest of cheese over top and bake, uncovered, 25 to 35 minutes.

Asparagus with Orange Sauce
This simple dish sings 'spring.' Serve asparagus on toast, topped with poached eggs for a simple supper or luncheon to share with friends. Serves four.

**Ingredients:** 1/4 cup butter

grated rind of 1 orange

juice of 1 orange 1 lb. asparagus, trimmed

4 slices bread, toasted (optional)

orange slices for garnish or poached egg for each serving (options)

Combine butter, orange rind, and juice in a small saucepan. Bring to boil; reduce heat and simmer, stirring occasionally, until mixture is reduced by half and slightly thickened. Set aside to keep warm. In large skillet in small amount of boiling water, cook asparagus three to five minutes, or until crisp-tender; drain well. # Transitioning To Renewable Energy Will Be Tricky In New Hampshire

April, and last summer was the hottest on record.

The ocean temperatures in the Gulf of Maine last summer were the warmest they have ever been, which is great for swimming at usually cold Hampton Beach, but not so great for the climate.

is in the midst of developing strategies for reducing the fossil fuel emissions driving climate change.

buildings with electricity instead of fossil fuels also spikes the demand for power.

Today in New England the vast majority of electricity is generated by burning natural gas, while far less harmful than coal or oil, it is a fossil fuel and a global hot commodity, especially liquified natural gas which New England relies on to produce electricity in the winter when most of the natural gas supplies are allocated for home heating.

And that will be a growing problem in the near future according to the ISO New England, which manages the wholesale electric market for the region, as New Hampshire and other New England states return to a winter peak demand region in the mid 2030s instead of the current summer peak demand

driven by air conditioning.

ISO-New England released its 2024 Regional Electricity Outlook last week and it paints a very complex, inter-related and arduous path for the region's transition to renewable energy as the main source of power generation.

While most of New England has greatly expanded Winter was mild with little snow this year until the use of renewable sources of power, New Hampshire on the tail end, much of it is "behind the meter" which means it is used where it is generated and never goes onto the grid.

The increase in solar – and to some extent wind is enough to drive down demand significantly in New England, like most of the developed world, the summer, which creates its own problems with day-ahead energy forecasts and the weather.

And the large wind and solar resources are re-The push for electric vehicles and for heating duced by the more extreme weather experienced the past few years.

> The ISO also notes improved battery storage technology will be needed to increase capacity, but warns when it is needed most - in the winter when natural gas for producing electricity is scarce and expensive – is when it is least efficient.

> And the most reliable and cheapest renewable energy resource for New England and New York has been hydro power from Hydro Quebec, which now faces pressure from the provincial government to retain its available resources to meet the growing demand at home driven by large users like Amazon and General Motors that were lured to the province by cheap electricity.

> And Hydro Quebec is still under contract to provide 2,400 megawatts of power to two major Northeast projects under construction, Champlain Hudson Power Express and New England Clean Energy Connect through Maine for Massachusetts

> So the ISO warns that despite the push to end the burning of fossil fuels, the uncertainty of renewable resources today requires "some amount of flexible, dispatchable resources - whether they are carbonemitting or not - will continue to play a role in filling supply gaps and ensuring the reliable flow of electricity.

> And the ISO urges all stakeholders to jump on the bandwagon, saying "At the same time, it is increasingly imperative for the energy industry, affected communities, and siting bodies and policymakers to overcome obstacles that have kept some projects from coming to fruition."



# Time To Finish Planting

Our season here in New Hampshire is very short. If you don't get things in the ground as soon as you can, you may have to wait until next year. The rule for tender crops is that you don't want to plant them until after the last full moon before Memorial Day. This year, that's the 23rd.

What I generally do is get the beds ready as soon as I can. Cleaning up the leaves and the leftover weeds takes a good deal of time but can be done anytime after the snow melts. Adding soil amendments, too, like Azomite powder and kelp meal can also be done ahead of time. Finding the right plants to put in the



ground can take a bit of sourcing. We have many nurseries here and they all have their specialties. There is a good chance that you can find exactly what you want.

Tomatoes are many gardeners favorites. I like

to dig a deep hole then fill it with 1½ gallons of water before planting them. This puts a lot of water deep into the ground and encourages the plants to send their roots down. Tomatoes can actually be planted as deep as you can as they will evolve more roots along the stem. Take off any leaves that are close to the soil. It's a good idea to mulch them as well to help stave off the blights. I like to use a couple inches of chopped up leaves covered with some straw. The leaves need to be chopped up or they will choke the plant. If you don't have a leaf chopper, a lawn mower can do the job for you. Tomatoes also need to be staked. I get natural muslin fabric and cut strips for this purpose. String can cut into the tomato plant. I also take off the suckers and only allow one stem to grow. They should be placed 16 to 24 inches apart. These amazing plants can also self pollinate. You can help the bees by running your fingers over the flowers.

Sweet peppers or hot peppers can be planted a bit closer to each other. They sometimes need staking and sometimes not depending upon the variety. Pepper plants like to be warm so it's best to not put them out until the night time temperatures stay above 55 degrees. This might not occur until June.

Okra is another plant that likes it warm. These plants can get really tall so A Yard & Plant Sale will be held on Saturday, May ask if what you are buying is a dwarf variety. This is more likely to grow well

> Basil is another plant that is very frost sensitive. I find that it can "go by" after a term so I tend to plant the seeds around the end of May. This way, I know that it will be available when I make my spaghetti sauce and garden delight in the summer. I broadcast the seeds and thin them after they come up. They can be harvested by snipping off the tops; they will send out side shoots. This is one of my favorite herbs to dry. It takes a little extra time, but it is delicious in the winter when added to meat balls or salmon cakes.

> Summer squash and winter squash plants can usually be found at local nurseries. I have had some trouble with the squash borer until I learned to cover a full five or six inches of the stem from where it enters the earth in aluminum foil. Keeping an eye on the plants is also essential and Captain Jack's Deadbug Brew spray helps.

Remember, time is of the essence now. Get plants in the ground and prepare for a wonderful summer of luscious veggies and beautiful flowers. Enjoy!

here at Healthy Home Habitat's urban eco gardens. bevy of fruit in September. I think it's the final addition to the medley of fruits that have become quite plentiful over the last several shrub. Their large and gorgeous umbel of lacy blooms years. I have fond childhood memories of eating mulberries by the handful June through August.

Curious? The process of growing some of your fruit at home couldn't be easier in our ecoregion. You probably already know that blueberries, both highbush, Vaccinium cormbosum, and lowbush, Vaccinium angustifolium, are native to our ecoregion. Their delicate bell-shaped flowers are lovely. They thrive in our sandy soil. They also offer a spectacular show of scarlet red fall color. Even better, they feed not only fruit to us in July (mainly the highbush) but fruit to wildlife (lowbush) and their leaves feed/are host to the elegant, frosted elfin butterfly.

You may also have dealt with another native berry plant that we, as humans, enjoy eating but don't enjoy tending, our blackberry shrubs/canes really, Rubus allegheniensis, sport wicked thorns but their berries are nutritional powerhouses. Blackberries contain high levels of anthocyanins, which not only provide their deep purple color in July and August but also help to fight free radical damage in our bodies.

Contrary to many gardeners, growing strawberries for me had been an exercise in frustration and misery. Several years ago I left many to naturalize as a terrific groundcover or green mulch. They now provide tiny, berry jewels that I discover during other gardening tasks in June.

I had added a peach and cherry tree to our fruitscape several years ago. These non-native hybrids are subject to many diseases. Additionally, the industry's version of "dwarf," 20' tall x 20' wide has required more strenuous efforts than I prefer. However, I am excited to reap the rewards this July and August of a radically-different management approach I began last year. This required pollarding the trees down to much smaller versions of themselves. They are now no taller than I can reach. The approach is explained by Ann Ralph, author of Grow a Little Fruit Tree. The trimming happened last season and both trees are tiny and full of blooms.

My full sun growing conditions and our sandy soil are also wonderful for the native Beach Plum, Prunus maritima. These small trees/large shrubs are covered in white blooms as we speak. They produce small plums with large pits, August to October, but I enjoy their flavor.

My Bluebell Grape vine will finally have two dedicated spans of lattice this year in full sun. Last season's late frost killed many of the blossoms, but

I wash and slow cook all of these fruits with their skins over many hours to create a thick compote, wonderful and sweet without sugar. We freeze batches in four and eight ounce ball jars to add to yogurt, spread on toast, and add to smoothies or desserts all winter long.

# Transitioning To Renewable Energy

Earlier this spring National Grid decided its Twin

The 1,200 megawatt transmission project running from Quebec through Vermont and New Hampshire largely in existing transmission corridors, would have been bi-directional allowing Hydro-Quebec power to sure thing. flow to New England and anticipated wind power from Southern New England offshore wind farms has the region's largest electric utility, Eversource, to flow to Canada.

National Grid did not say why it pulled out, but the availability of Hydro-Quebec power is likely one reason, and the slow development of the proposed offshore wind projects is likely another reason. More utilities are pulling out of offshore projects than are jumping in right now.

The National Grid project had won US Department of Energy approval for transmission projects guaranteeing backstop purchases of power to ensure financing, and New England states are also seeking similar backing for two other projects, Power Up New England, and Clean Reliance Link.

Power Up New England would construct transmission lines to access wind farms in Northern Maine has lots of landmines and is like threading a needle. and offshore in Southern New England and battery systems for both, while Clean Reliance Link would be a transmission upgrade between New York and New England to share resources.

The wind farms in the north and south are also included in the ISO-New England's long-term order and at the right time for New England to prooutlook for transitioning the New England grid to renewable resources along with additional Hydro-Quebec power.

Although the ISO does not have any authority over the transmission system, it notes in its 2024 outlook the need for billions of dollars of upgrades and new connections.

"Cumulative costs to upgrade the transmission system could reach \$17 billion to reliably serve a 51 gigawatt peak in 2050, or \$26 billion to support a 57 gigawatt peak," ISO officials wrote. "To reach those levels, the region's annual investment in transmission reliability projects over the next 26 years would need to roughly keep pace with or exceed the average spent each year over the past two decades."

The organization estimates \$620 million to \$1 bil-State Energy Link project was not feasible at this time. lion in transmission reliability investment is needed each year through 2050 to support the transmission to clean energy.

That is a significant amount of money and no

A dispute with energy regulators in Connecticut reducing its investment in the transmission system in that state by \$500 million over the next five years.

The company believes state regulators have been slow to approve the recovery of \$635 million in storm costs from 2018 to 2021, and \$400 million in unpaid bills from customers, prompting Eversource's CEO Joseph Nolan to say last week "Without a secure and predictable cost recovery path, we cannot continue to put additional capital resources on the table. So our investment objectives in Connecticut have been centered around safety and reliability. As you'd expect, we will not reduce our safety spending. Therefore the reduction will likely come from reliability areas."
