The Colonial will host performances that celebrate jazz, folk, and singer-songwriters as well, with the inspired poetry and guitar playing of Bruce Cockburn (11/2); Peter Yarrow and Noel Paul Stookey of Peter, Paul and Mary (11/15); Scott Bradlee's Postmodern Jukebox, bringing the classic stylings and sounds of jazz and Motown to mainstream music (12/13); and Canada's reigning couple of Celtic music, Natalie MacMaster and Donnell Leahy (3/14).

Happy Father's Day To All Dads

This Sunday is Father's Day. Why not get dad off his feet, into a comfortable chair with his favorite beverage in-hand, and take over the grilling or cooking chores. Cater to dad's comforts by preparing a meal around his favorite foods. Keep the emphasis on big flavors and simple, casual eating enjoyment. Finish up with dad's favorite pie or dessert.



Pork Burgers

Ground pork can be purchased from your favorite butcher or supermarket for these flavorful pork burgers, a delicious change-of-pace treat for grilled burger fans. Ingredients:

1 lb. ground pork

salt and pepper Worcestershire sauce

4 poppy seed burger buns or others of choice

mavonnaise

4 slices cooked bacon

blue cheese or 4 slices of other favorite cheese

Portion the pork into four patties and season generously with salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce. Cook the burgers on the medium-cool side of your grill, about six minutes on one side and five minutes on the other, for medium-done pork. Grill buns until nicely browned; spread each with mayonnaise, stuff with a burger and top with bacon, blue cheese and a bit of arugula.

Beef Kebabs

If dad loves his beef, get the kids to help assemble this foil-packet meal for four that can be either grilled or roasted in the oven.

Ingredients:

11/4 lb. sirloin tips, cut into 1-inch chunks

8 small potatoes (about 1½" size)

1 medium zucchini, cut into chunks

8 cherry tomatoes

1 red or green pepper, seeded and cut into 8 chunks

1 onion, cut into 8 chunks 4 medium-sized whole mushrooms

4 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 teaspoons salt

4 small pieces of bay leaf freshly ground black pepper

2 teaspoons each dried oregano, mint and thyme; 1

teaspoon sugar (combine all in small bowl)

Place meat in the center of a 12x18-inch piece of heavy-duty aluminum foil. Cover and surround the meat with the vegetables, parsley, and garlic. Season evenly with remaining ingredients, sprinkling over all. Seal foil tightly and grill over medium-high heat, turning occasionally, or place foil packet on a cookie sheet and roast in 375 degree oven, 45 to 60 minutes.

BBQ Chicken

A simple homemade sauce keeps this chicken moist and juicy. Use a whole cut-up chicken or assorted parts, and cook this on your covered grill. Perfect with potato salad, baked beans and/or coleslaw. Serves eight but recipe may be halved, if desired. **Ingredients:**

2 cloves garlic minced

2 teaspoons butter

1 cup ketchup

4 tablespoons brown sugar

1/4 cup bottled chili sauce 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

1 teaspoon celery seed

1 tablespoon prepared mustard

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 dashes hot pepper sauce

2 broiler chickens (3½ to 4 lbs. each), cut up, or equal amount desired chicken parts

In large saucepan, sauté garlic in butter until tender. Add rest of sauce ingredients, except chicken.

"My father taught me not to overthink things, that Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; set aside. Lightly oil grill rack; grill chicken, covered, over medium heat for 30 minutes, turning occasionally. Baste with sauce. Grill until a thermometer reaches 170 degrees, about 15 minutes longer, basting and turning a few times.

Pickled Market Slaw

Instead of mayonnaise, why not try this lighter salad with lots of texture and flavor from a sweetsour dressing that's reminiscent of bread and butter pickles. Refrigerate this salad at least 24 hours before serving. Makes six servings.

Ingredients:

4 tablespoons apple cider vinegar

1 tablespoon orange juice concentrate

1 tablespoon Dijon mustard

1 tablespoon honey

1/4 cup olive oil

1/2 head green cabbage, thinly sliced

1 cup red cabbage, thinly sliced

2 large carrots, shredded 3 scallions, thinly sliced

1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley

salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

In a small bowl, whisk together vinegar, orange juice, mustard, honey, and olive oil; set aside. In large bowl, combine remaining ingredients except salt and pepper. Drizzle a small amount of dressing over the slaw and toss. Add more dressing to taste and season with salt and pepper.

> No-Bake Rhubarb (or Strawberry) Bars

Choose dad's favorite, rhubarb or strawberry. Enjoy these bars chilled or frozen; may be made a day or two ahead of when you plan to serve it. Ingredients:

Crust:

10 full graham crackers, 1 sleeve

1 tablespoon brown sugar

6 tablespoons butter, melted

Filling:

2 cups rhubarb, chopped in 1-inch pieces (or fresh strawberries)

3 tablespoons sugar

6 tablespoons water

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk

1 cup cold heavy cream

Combine the graham crackers, sugar, and melted butter together until fully combine. Press crust firmly and evenly into the bottom of a buttered 9x9-inch square baking pan Chill the crust while you make the filling. Put chopped rhubarb (or strawberries) and sugar in a saucepan along with the water. Bring to a boil and simmer until thick and soft, about eight to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally so fruit doesn't scorch. Blend in the vanilla and lemon and set aside to cool. When rhubarb is cool, blend in the condensed milk. Whip the cream to stiff peaks; fold it into the rhubarb mixture gently but completely. Spread evenly over the crust and put back in the refrigerator to chill for at least two to three hours. Makes nine to 12 servings.





Garden Mindfulness

I try to be mindful in the garden for many reasons, part because the birds, fireflies, toads and snakes all but the most important is that I care about the land around me.

I was watching the Chelsea Flower Show on YouTube last week, and they too are becoming more mindful, even if it is a flower show for one week. In the floristry division they are no longer allowing floral foam, meaning all mechanics have to be compostable, or reusable, which is huge, because a lot of floral foam All new shrubs get a deep soak every week or two has been used in the past and it would just go into the landfill and off-gas.

Water recovery was huge at the show with many gardens creating swale gardens and water retention gardens so that the water can be used at a later date. Especially in light of bigger storms, with proper catchment basins the storm water is slowed from creating damage and drains into the ground rather than out into the street and drainage systems. This was really beauty and function working well together. Can you create a swale garden to collect runoff from your roof?

In the past after the Chelsea Flower Show, the dismantled and then rebuilt in another place, be it hospital grounds or even a community garden space and the farm happy. so it is a win-win for all.

Here at the farm, we let a huge space go wild mowed short and mulched for the spring bulb show. based in Hancock. Don't worry about the insects having enough places to overwinter. I can not stand slugs and I seem to have an abundance of them this year in the gardens. The damage is unbelievable, but I leave them be for the most



Taking Care Of The Garden

fall. Nothing could be further from the truth. All those plants that you have in the garden are sentient beings, and it is your job to take care of them.

I check out the whole garden on a daily basis. In the morning, I look for bugs because they are less and others will most likely need to be thinned. Look able to fly away from us when it is cool. Bring an old yogurt container with some water and dish washing liquid in it. You can knock the bugs into it and the soap will kill them. Or, if you have chickens, just put or dinner. Remember to always take the smaller one. businesses. Celeste is also water in it and then bring them over to the chickens.



Look for weeds, especially the ones that are flowering and getting ready to form seeds. One small bunch of grass can have hundreds of seeds on it. Once they drop, they will be giving you more grass weeds for up to seven years. If I am short on time, I will just peruse the garden and take out the flowering weeds. Also check all of the edges. If you have grass growing on over the fence, and I tie the edge of a bed, make sure that you don't let it go to seed into the bed. Cut it back.
