

Noises Off! Opens The Peterborough Players Season

The Peterborough Players kicks off their 2024 Summer Season with the laugh-out-loud comedy, Noises Off! Called the funniest farce ever, the inspiration came to English playwright Michael Frayn when he was watching one of his plays from the theater wings.

He quickly realized that what was happening behind the stage was funnier than what was happening on the stage, and so, *Noises Off!* was born – a play within a play, where the audience gets to go where no audience has gone before: backstage.

Noises Off! begins with a company of actors trying to navigate their way through a final rehearsal of a farce called *Nothing On*. The person responsible for trying to wrangle them on and off stage is the assistant stage manager, Poppy Taylor-Norton, played by Lizzy Ryland. Making her Players debut, the New York-based actor was thrilled to be in the comedy as she has a passion for making people laugh. Although she has never stage-managed before, playing Poppy has given her an appreciation for how challenging it can be to organize a troupe of performers.

Luckily for her, and the rest of the Noises Off! cast, they have Lauren Pekel as their production stage manager. Pekel has collected quite a few stories of backstage shenanigans through her work in theaters across the country. She recalls working with actors who missed their entrances, left important props backstage, and completely forgot their lines, although "not in the same show, thank God!" Each incident has taught her how to use her ingenuity and creativity to make sure that the show goes on.

Household Rules Create Family Harmony

Household rules create a foundation within the family.

Household rules don't need to be a huge endeavor. Start by creating routines that you follow daily. Have a set time for daily activities such as mealtimes and bedtimes. Create rituals and routines around these moments. For example, having a regular dinner where the family gathers together promotes communication and connection among family members. This time can provide an opportunity to teach kids your expectations about table manners and how the family talks to one another. Use this time to reinforce how you want your kids to behave at mealtimes.

Use bedtime routines to build connection and set hygiene expectations. Make the experience enjoyable by incorporating tasks such as reading a story together to promote relaxation. Doing the same basic routine daily creates a pattern that will help promote good hygiene, build family connections, encourage good habits, and even develop literacy skills.

Household rules can foster respect and positive connections between family members. Use rules to maintain appropriate boundaries, such as teaching kids to knock before entering someone's room, helps kids recognize the need for privacy and personal space. Consistently reinforcing the household rules will help family members learn to navigate conflicts peacefully and develop empathy toward one another.

Having clear and consistent rules at home will help kids when they encounter issues outside of the walls of your home. They will learn and internalize the values that you are teaching, and this will allow them to navigate relationships and situations in other environments. For examples, rules about telling the truth support children's understanding of the importance of honesty and integrity. Rules about treating siblings with kindness emphasize the importance of treating others with kindness. Household rules promote safety and general wellbeing. Children don't have the maturity and brain


Establishing rules and routines cre-rules and expectations reduces chaos and confusion. development to always make the best decisions for their own safety. They rely on the adults in their lives to set boundaries to ensure their safety. Having clear rules minimizes risks and hazards to keep kids safe. Rules related to the level of supervision required to run certain appliances, wearing bike helmets when riding, technology usage, curfews, bedtimes, etc. all promote safe and healthy habits. Kids won't always make choices that are in their best interest without some oversight from concerned adults. When parents set rules to prioritize safety and well-being, they create a safe and nurturing environment for kids to grow and thrive.



Establishing a clear set of household rules leads to a well-functioning family. Rules provide structure, promote respect among family members, and set the stage for developing family values. Of course, establishing rules will not guarantee that kids always follow them, so parents need to remind, encourage, and address issues as they occur with consistency, firmness, and fairness. It may be necessary to revisit the rules periodically to ensure they are still effective and age appropriate and adjust them as needed.

Like so many things in life, managing household rules is a constant work in progress. Approach them with a combination of affection and discipline, and remember consistency is the key to success

Non-Native, Invasive Plants In New Hampshire

be aware of all the non-native, invasive Some of these invasive plants are a result of escaping from a managed appearance and low-maintenance, they can quickly overrun and dominate natural environments where they compete with native plants. Former popular landscaping plants like purple loosestrife, burning bush and Norway maple are on the list of prohibited invasive plants in New Hampshire.

There are many more that devastate our landscape and take over our fields and roadside grass.

The Giant hogweed (Heracleum plant that can cause painful burns and scarring. Brushing against or breaking the plant releases sap that combined with sunlight and moisture can cause a severe burn within 24 to 48 hours.

Chokecherry trees (Prunus virginiana) are blossoming everywhere along our roadsides and they're very easy to see. They are small trees that sometimes can resemble shrubs when they grow in a group. There is an incredible If pollinated, each flower will become a dark purple, one-seeded berry (drupe) which, though edible, can be bitter or sour. Many Native American tribes used the fruit as food and used other parts of the tree. They used the inner bark, medicinally.

The butterfly bush displaces native plants by physically occupying the space that native plants would normally grow. They also offer copious amounts of nectar that become extremely attractive to pollinators, distracting them

from other native flowering species thus reducing the native's reproductive success which eventually harms their populations. By favoring this plant in our gardens, we may be indirectly harming the survival and successful reproduction of many of

Purple loosestrife has spread rapidly across North America and is present in nearly every Canadian province and

almost every US state. This plant has the ability to produce as many as two million seeds in a growing season, creating dense stands of purple loosestrife that outcompete native plants for habitat.

The invasive plant that covers everything is the Kudzu which kills or damages other plants by smothering them under a blanket of leaves. It covers tree trunks, breaking branches and even uprooting entire trees. The Kudzu's ability to grow quickly and survive in mantegazzianum) is a very large invasive areas of low nitrogen availability allows it to displace native species.

Japanese Stiltgrass (Microstegium vimineum) can grow in a variety of habitats where it forms dense stands and crowds out native species. It is an aggressive invader of forest lands throughout the eastern US. Infestations can impact the diversity of native species, reduce wildlife habitat, and disrupt important ecosystem functions.

How To Help Meet The Greatest Challenge In Human History

When it comes to our overheating planet, three questions matter most: What's energy sources, and more efficient, effective energy going on? Why is it important? What can we do? Let's tackle these three ques-

What's going on? Our species, Homo sapiens, has been around for about 300,000 years, but we've been massively polluting for only about the last 70. And over the last five decades, we've experienced what some call "The Great Acceleration": more than doubling the size of the human population, and even more important, more than quintupling the size of the world's economies.

All that growth has been driven by burning dirty fossil fuels such as coal, oil, and gas - and as it turns out, that pollution stays up in the air for a long, long time, a thickening blanket in the sky all around us, overheating the planet.

The last nine years are the nine hottest in recorded human history; 2023 was the hottest yet, and 2024 is on track to beat it. And within the lifetime of a child born today, we're currently on track to more than double the overheating we've caused so far.



Here's an analogy we all can relate to: Imagine a car sitting for a few hours in a sunny parking lot on a summer day. The sunlight passes through the glass, heating up the car's interior, and the glass and metal traps the heat in – creating a life-threatening situation for pets or children inside the car. That's essentially what we've been doing these last 70 years or so: The solar system is a sunny parking lot, the heat-trapping pollution we're spewing into the sky is forming a

> giant car around the planet, and our home is getting dangerously hot.

> Why is this important? Because overheating the planet leads to more extreme weather, more extreme vulnerability, and more extreme unrest. Extreme weather means more major storms, floods, melting ice caps and snowpack, sea level rise, droughts, wildfires, and wildfire smoke. Extreme vulnerability means more heat waves, toxic air, crop failures, hunger, thirst, poverty, disease, and extinct species. Extreme unrest means more refugees, conflict, and sociopolitical turbulence. That's why Earth's overheating is important: If we allow current trends to continue, we'll bequeath a much more difficult and dangerous

> world to our children and grandchildren. What can we do? Four things: First, we can stop the major polluters from continuing to thicken the blanket that's overheating the planet. Second, we can help speed up the upgrade to cleaner, cheaper, safer

usage. Third, we can conserve and restore the parts of creation (like forests and peat bogs) that help remove some of the carbon pollution out of the air, thinning the blanket and cooling the planet. And fourth, we can spread the word about all of this, set an example, and help shift the cultural conversation (including the political conversation) away from polarized partisanship and toward common sense, practical wisdom, and cooperative action.

That last item – spreading the word – is crucial. The challenge we face is primarily a cultural challenge: the science is settled, feasible technological remedies are at hand (and forthcoming), and the economics of clean energy are already outstripping the economics of dirty fossil fuels. What remains is the cultural work of building a movement: Talking about the problem and its solutions with friends and neighbors in clear, accessible, non-jargonistic terms; forging alliances; electing officials who share our values; and rejecting the lie that a livable world is a partisan issue. Republicans, Democrats, and Independents breathe the same air, drink the same water, enjoy the same forests and lakes and rivers and neighboring creatures. A livable world is not a politically partisan goal. It's a human goal - and it's one we can achieve together.

We created the majority of this problem over the last five decades, since the early 1970s, and this is the decade, the 2020s, in which we need to take major strides toward solving it. The cavalry isn't coming; we are the cavalry! By almost any measure (potential death, disease, displacement, extinctions), this is the greatest challenge (and opportunity!) in human history. The call to action is ringing like a bell on the



In others, white is used for death and mourning. Maybe white is both, and more. When white is clear and crisp and pure, there is a soothing simplicity to its tones that is both modest and bold.

Green. How could the color green not be love? The green of the grasses and leaves and plants. The green that sustains us, that nourishes us. The feeling of lying in the green grass or that first green of spring after a long winter in New England.



Yesterday, we walked a trail back from Half Moon Beach that took us under tendrils of vines that made a variegated roof above our heads and gave us shade in the hot afternoon sun. For at least one quarter mile we were all alone in that multilayered canopy of green.

Here in Vieques, the flamboyan trees are in full bloom. Their bright red clusters of flowers are truly flamboyant, they spill from the branches like gigantic popcorn balls. This red is bold and confident, like the crown of the various roosters now crowing the morning sunrise outside my hotel room window. Yes, this also feels like love to me.

In the deepest of our New England winters, when all around is white or shades of grey, I will sometimes pull up memories of that color red and infuse it through me - to help me push through the cold and bleak times outside.

This may be because in Feng Shui I was born in a fire year. Whatever the reason, red has always called to me. Several years ago, we were choosing colors of office furniture. Everyone except for me wanted blue. I wanted red. Blue won out (which was probably for the best). At that time, several people told me they disliked red, that it made them uncomfortable. And I felt I had to advocate for the color that always attracts me, like a moth to flame.

Purple and orange can surprise us. Those colors are not as omnipresent around our landscapes, and thus can move and shake us with their power and tones when we do see them. As in a flower. Or the orange of Buddhist monk's robe. Or the purple of a piece of amethyst.

And what about yellow? The sun is most often represented as yellow. And while it often appears as yellow, our sun-star that nourishes us all on planet Earth is of many colors – depending when and how we choose to see it. At sunrise and sunset, the sun can be pink and orange and magenta and more. Sometimes if you look at the sun just so, you can find touches of lime green and lavender. And then when the sun is not in the sky, it is black to us.

It's Strawberry Festival Fun Time

While festivals at local churches every June and July. While strawberry festivals don't seem to be as prevalent as they were back in the 40s and 50s, I've noticed lately that ads and notices for strawberry festival craft fairs show that they are making a comeback. Search one out - take the family for some fun times!

To keep strawberries, rinse them off (but don't soak in water) and dry them well. Refrigerate the dry strawberries in shallow containers. You may also freeze dry whole strawberries on a cookie sheet until firm; transfer to heavy plastic bags or five-quart plastic ice cream buckets. My favorite way to save strawberries is to roast them and then freeze in jellysize or pint canning jars - wonderful to enjoy on a



Roasted Strawberries

This is the easiest and most useful way to prepare strawberries that I've ever come across. Use the roasted berries on shortcake or pound cake, in muffins or on toast, or simply enjoy atop cereal, yogurt, pudding or ice cream. I also freeze these roasted berries in jelly jars (leave 1/4-inch headroom for expansion) and enjoy them all winter long.

Ingredients:

1 lb. strawberries, cleaned and hulled

1/4 cup sugar

Preheat oven to 450 degrees; center the oven rack. Halve or quarter large berries. Place berries in a roasting pan; add sugar and toss well. Roast berries for 18 to 20 minutes, stirring once or twice. Cool; store in refrigerator up to one week or freeze for longer storage.

Strawberry-Orange Yogurt Pancakes

Enjoy this different pancake preparation for a leisurely breakfast or brunch treat some weekend. Makes two to three servings.

Ingredients:

1 cup strawberries, hulled and sliced

4 teaspoons sugar, divided

1/3 cup orange juice

3/4 cup strawberry yogurt 1 large egg

2 tablespoons melted butter 1 cup flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

Combine strawberries and two teaspoons sugar; let stand one half hour. Combine remaining two teaspoons sugar, orange juice, yogurt, egg and melted butter; mix well. In another bowl, sift together flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Add yogurtorange mixture to dry ingredients and mix well; fold in strawberries. Batter will be thick. Cook pancakes on hot griddle. Serve with maple syrup or strawberry sauce. Makes two to three servings.

Fresh Strawberry Sauce

This luscious sauce is a treat to use on pancakes or waffles, on puddings or as a filling for trifle, or serve it on yogurt or in your favorite smoothie. Makes one pint.

Ingredients:

1 lb. fresh strawberries

1/4 cup sugar, more or less to taste

2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice

dash vanilla extract

1 tablespoon strawberry fraise or other berry liqueur (optional)

Combine strawberries, sugar, lemon juice, and vanilla in a saucepan. Mash the berries with a fork to release juices, then bring them to a boil over mediumhigh heat. Reduce heat to medium-low, continue to mash the berries as needed, and simmer until they are all soft, 15 to 20 minutes. Puree the berries with an immersion blender or food processor until smooth. Add the liqueur if using, blending once or twice to incorporate it. Cool sauce to room temperature and refrigerate it to use as needed. Keeps up to one week refrigerated.

American Salad

This striking, patriotic red, white, and blue salad is colored with strawberries, blueberries, mozzarella and other tasty ingredients. It's perfect for summer holidays or BBQs. The white vinegar keeps the color of this salad bright and fresh. Makes six servings.

1/3 cup olive oil

1/4 cup julienned fresh basil

3 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar (or other white wine vinegar)

2 tablespoons minced fresh mint leaves

1 garlic clove, minced

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

1/2 teaspoon each salt, sugar and pepper

1 cup sliced or quartered fresh strawberries

4 cups fresh baby arugula (or other baby greens of choice)

4 ozs. fresh mozzarella cheese pearls, drained 1 medium fresh peach, sliced (optional, but nice if

1 cup fresh blueberries

3 ozs. thinly sliced prosciutto, julienned additional mint for garnish

In a small bowl, whisk together olive oil with white vinegar and seasonings. In large bowl, combine strawberries, arugula, cheese, peaches (if using), blueberries, and prosciutto. Pour the dressing over and toss by hand to coat everything well. Garnish with additional mint and serve.

In a medium bowl, combine all the salsa ingredients; refrigerate until serving time. For crisps, brush flour tortillas with butter; cut each into eight wedges. Combine sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl; sprinkle over wedges. Place on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 350 degrees for five to 10 minutes or just until crisp. Serve with the fruit salsa. Makes two and a half cups salsa.
