Citronella grass is a perennial grass known for its strong, lemony scent and mosquito-repelling properties. It's a popular choice for gardens and outdoor spaces due to its aromatic foliage and ability to deter insects. It has tall, slender, arching leaves that can reach two to five feet in height. 

While asset diversification is fundamental, it is just as important to achieve tax diversification. Specifically, it may be prudent to further diversify your investments into three tax categories.

Tax-deferred

Tax-deferred accounts include a traditional IRA, employer-sponsored retirement plan or deferred annuity. IRAs and 401(k)s are typically funded with pretax dollars, which may help reduce taxable income in the tax year that dollars are contributed, and all types of deferred accounts allow interest, dividends and capital gains to compound year after year without being taxed.

Distributions are subject to tax at your ordinary income tax rate when they are withdrawn. There may be a penalty for withdrawals made before age 591/2, and minimum distributions are required annually from these accounts after age 73.

**Taxable** 

Your standard brokerage account is a taxable account. Gains on securities held in taxable accounts for one year or less are subject to short-term capital gains tax equal to your ordinary income tax rate. Securities held for more than one year are subject to a lower longterm capital gains tax.



#### **Potluck Tote And Share Foods**

Summer is frequently a time of reunions for many families and schoolmates. In fact, many town Old Home Days also began as small reunion gatherings. Food is always a big part of these gatherings. Heaping bowls of garden greens and fresh vegetables, mixed fruits, pasta and potato salads, and coleslaw are always popular. Be sure to keep any mayonnaise-based salads well chilled. Prepare one of your favorite casserole recipes, make a pot of baked beans, or cook a big ham or turkey. Or try some of this week's recipes from Cooking Corner when it's your turn to tote and share some food at a potluck table.



Mexican Lasagna
This blue-ribbon casserole is quite attractive and not too spicy, so it should satisfy most tastes. Several layers of corn tortillas replace lasagna in this dish, making it quite simple to put it together once everything is assembled. Makes eight servings.

**Ingredients:** 

1½ pounds lean ground beef

1½ teaspoons ground cumin (or sub-in coriander) 1 tablespoon chili powder or less, to taste

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper

1/2 teaspoon salt

freshly ground black pepper

1 can (16 oz.) tomatoes, drained and chopped

10-12 corn tortillas, divided

2 cups small curd cottage cheese, drained

1 cup grated Monterey Jack cheese, with or without peppers

1 large egg

1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese

2 cups shredded lettuce

1/2 cup chopped fresh tomatoes

3 scallions, chopped

1/4 cup sliced black olives

In a large skillet, brown ground beef; drain thoroughly. Add cumin, chili powder, garlic powder, cayenne pepper, salt, pepper and tomatoes; heat through. Cover bottom and sides of a 13x9x2-inch baking dish with half the tortillas. Pour beef mixture over tortillas; place a second layer of tortillas over meat mixture and set aside. Combine cottage cheese, Monterey Jack cheese and egg; pour over tortillas. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 to 45 minutes. Remove from oven. Sprinkle cheddar cheese, lettuce, tomatoes, green onions, and olives in rows diagonally across center of casserole. Hint: I start with a diagonal row of cheddar cheese in the middle, then alternate diagonal rows of lettuce, tomato, olives and green onions on

#### Sesame Chicken Strips

A platter of these are a favorite of young and old alike. Serve them as appetizers or as part of the potiuck table servings.

**Ingredients:** 

1 cup mayonnaise

2 teaspoons dried minced onion

2 teaspoons dry mustard

1 cup crushed butter-flavored crackers (or substitute vour favorite)

1/2 cup sesame seeds

2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken breasts

Sauce:

1 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons honey

In a flat bowl, combine mayonnaise, onion and mustard; set aside. In another flat bowl, combine cracker crumbs and sesame seeds; set aside. Cut chicken lengthwise into quarter-inch strips. Dip strips into mayonnaise mixture, then into sesame seed mixture. Place in a single layer on a large greased or foil-covered baking sheet. Bake at 425 degrees for 18 to 20 minutes or until juices run clear. Combine sauce ingredients and serve for dipping with chicken strips.

#### **Corn-Scallion Strata**

It's always nice to have a vegetable dish on the potluck table. This popular corn dish can also be easily made with any type of bread and cheese you have on hand. Dish is prepared a day ahead, making it easier on the cook. Leftovers are great in lunch boxes. **Ingredients:** 

1 tablespoon butter

3 cups fresh corn (cut from 3 small-to-average cobs) 11/2 cups thinly sliced scallions (both white and

green parts from a 4-ounce bundle) 8 cups whole wheat, country or French bread, torn in 1-inch cubes

2 cups (6 ounces) coarsely grated sharp cheddar 1 cup (2 ounces) finely grated parmesan

2 tablespoons mayonnaise

21/4 cups milk

1 teaspoon salt and freshly ground black pepper

Generously butter a three-quart baking dish (a lasagna or 9×13-inch pan works well here too). Toss corn and scallions together in a medium bowl; set aside. Combine cheeses in another bowl; set aside. In a large bowl, gently beat eggs and mayo together, then whisk in milk, salt, and a good amount of freshly ground black pepper. Spread one-third of bread cubes in prepared baking dish – it will not fully cover bottom of dish – this is fine. Add one-third of corn, then one-third of cheese mixture. Repeat layering twice with remaining bread, corn, and cheese. Pour egg mixture evenly over strata. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least eight hours or up to one day. When ready to bake, heat oven to 350 degrees. Bake strata, uncovered, until puffed, golden brown and cooked through, about 45 to 55 minutes. Let stand five minutes before serving.

#### Savory Herb Loaf

A loaf of Italian or French bread spread with butter and herbs makes a good accompaniment to nearly any meal. Makes eight to 10 servings.

**Ingredients:** 

1/2 cup butter, softened

2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

1 clove garlic, minced

1/4 teaspoon ground coriander

1 teaspoon ginger

1/2 teaspoon celery seed 1 long loaf French or Italian bread

Cut bread into one-inch slices, but not quite through; or slice bread lengthwise in half. Combine

butter with herbs; mix well. Spread butter on all available surfaces. Wrap in foil and refrigerate or freeze until ready to use. When ready to use, return to room temperature; then heat at 400 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes.






