Localism: Begin In My Backyard

where I'm so honored to serve as editor, recently published an issue highlighting localism. This issue quickly climbed the charts, becoming our most popular post since our start in 2021. Here's a summary of that issue and an invitation to learn more.

What Is Localism?

Michael Shuman, economist, author, and publisher of The Main Street Journal, shared four main principles of localism: action, power, partnership, and respect. As you read this summary, please note any local people, places, and policies that come to mind – already supporting or carrying out this work.

Localism Means Taking Action Near Home

"Localism means that if we discover a problem in our backyard, we address it immediately and locally," shared Michael. "The goal is not to go it alone,

The Main Street Journal, an online publication but to favor mindful action over inattention. Act, experiment, learn, try again. The operable phrase is not NIMBY (not in my backyard!), but BIMBY (begin in my backvard!)."

Localism Means Amplifying Local Power

"Localists insist that power be held primarily at the local level, with states holding less power, countries less still, and global institutions the least amount," continued Michael. "By power, we mean the power collectively to tax, regulate, and administer projects."

Localism Means Partnering Globally

"Localism does not necessarily mean going it alone," adds Michael. "It can also mean finding partners to serve local needs. Sometimes that's higher

Mulching And Irrigation During Our Hottest Days

As we come toward the end of the hottest days of the year, I'm reflecting on the difficulty of keeping a garden going during dry spouts. Over the last 20 years or so, I've tried every kind of mulch I could think of and a variety of irrigation options. I've also switched to growing almost entirely native perennials in our kitchen garden in order to cut down on using drinking water for garden spaces.



There are so many options for mulching: hay, straw, wood chips, pebbles. I've tried old newspapers and cardboard, even black plastic with holes cut in it for the plants, although that definitely was not ideal. A friend of mine with sheep tried wool, which worked for a time, but once it became muddy and smelly proved to be less desirable. At about \$4 a bale, the least expensive option is definitely mulch hay. The only problem with this is that the seed heads often leave little patches of grass behind in the garden. If not removed quickly, those small patches will become well-rooted mats of grass that are hard on the fingers and the back to get out the following Spring. An upgrade from mulch hay is straw. The seed heads are (mostly) removed from the stocks and you're left with a golden ground cover that smells good in the sun and holds moisture relatively well. It's my go-to for mulching fruits and vegetables. Lastly, a bit more expensive, but a really quite beautiful option is a dark tree bark, such as cedar. A truckload of it costs about \$50 to \$60. Something to consider is that it's a lot of work to spread around.

Combining mulch with careful irrigation can help beleaguered plants make it through the hot weeks. Irrigation is best done early in the morning or closer to dusk. Usually, I find myself walking around with a hose and a circular sprinkler. However, if you're willing to make an up-front investment, a drip irrigation line that crawls along each garden bed is wonderfully efficient in terms of water usage and your time.

Overall, my favorite combination for water retention is a drip-line irrigation with dark mulch spread all around. Budget sometimes dictates straw and a hose, however. Now that we're out of our nearly month-long streak of days over 90 degrees, I'm making plans for more efficient mulching and irrigation for next year, in hopes of saving hours of time walking around with a hose. I think \$100 for a roll of drip line and a few connector pieces will be worth it. I hope you've found some good ways to keep your gardens going through this heat wave. I would love to hear any creative methods. Happy gardening!

\$29.95 Home Education 101

Home educating, also known as homeschooling, is an alternative option to public or private schooling that some New Hampshire parents are choosing for their children. According to the New Hampshire Department of Education (www.education.nh.gov), "New Hampshire saw a significant uptick in K-12 non-public schooling in 2020, which was consistent with national trends." A study by the NHDE found "the chief factor influencing parents' decision was concern about the academic quality and schooling environment of the public school system.'

I want to start by saying that our area is fortunate to have both public and private schools that are exceptional and still have education as their main focus. Homeschooling is an alternative for those who want to give their child a personalized learning experience and a tailored curriculum at a pace suited to their child's individual needs and learning style.


The first year homeschooling my children I learned important lessons. Early on, I focused too much on book learning and strict schedules, which led to frustration and limited flexibility. Over time, I learned that effective homeschooling is about adaptability as much as academics. Here are some of my most valuable insights from that journey.

Be Prepared

This Boy Scout motto became my motto when homeschooling my sons. Be prepared with lesson planning. Be prepared with extracurricular activities. Be prepared when there is a hiccup in your day. What worked best for me was to take an hour or so out of my weekend to organize the following week's plans in each subject, our outdoor or exercise time, and any extras. Key takeaway: Consistent preparation each week creates smoother and more manageable homeschooling days.

When it comes to curriculum, there are many resources online. You can select one source for all subjects or pick and choose from many sources. Time4Learning, The Good and The Beautiful, Easy Peasy All-in-ONe, Abeka, Sonlight, and many other choices for curriculum can be found online. If you know someone who homeschools, get their feedback to what worked for their family.

A couple of years into homeschooling I found that "theme" studies aided in the direction of our education. These theme studies lasted four to six weeks; the children focused on a theme that included field trips, movies, the arts, the books that we read, and more. Their math, science, history, and English studies worked into each theme as well. We had a blast learning about Greek mythology, space, the medieval period, US presidents... the list goes on. To this day, my adult children talk about these themed studies and the fun they had.



Relax the Schedule

After that first year of learning my lessons about homeschooling, I relaxed my schedule to be a bit more flexible. One of the many positive aspects of homeschooling was that schooling wasn't a sevenhour day like it would be in other schooling situations. For us, the school day focused on three main subjects with about one hour per subject. Throwing in outside play time, reading time, and anything else "extra," our school day was usually completed by early afternoon.



Don't Forget the Extras

If there is one thing that a homeschool parent/ teacher will learn right off the bat, it is that everything extra you do can be worked into part of your children's education. For instance, taking your children grocery shopping can turn into a valuable education. You can work in health and nutrition, math, and reading into the mix by looking at ingredients, weighing fruits and vegetables, and calculating pounds to costs in the meat department. Give the older kids a calculator and the shopping list to the younger ones, who are more than likely working on their reading skills.

Be Spontaneous

After a rigid first year, I embraced flexibility, and every year after improved. My main advice: use the freedom of homeschooling to be spontaneous and adjust based on your family's needs.

While making your weekly school plans, include a few ideas that will be spontaneous (to the kids). They've been working hard, so why not throw in a mid-week vacation day? Pack up a lunch and a bag of sports equipment (soccer ball, frisbee, softball and mitts, etc.) and hike down to one of the local recreation areas to enjoy a day away from "schooling." Or take a picnic lunch and drive to a coastal beach to fly kites. Or take off to hike one of the many areas trails. This gets the kids outdoors for exercise, learning directions, making discoveries, and maybe even finding treasures.

Socializing Opportunities

One thing you'll want to look for is socializing opportunities for your homeschooled children. Getting them involved in sports, music lessons, art classes, volunteering in the community, doing co-op classes with other homeschoolers, youth groups, 4-H... there are many opportunities that they can get involved in.

Homeschooling your children can have parents facing some unique challenges. Focus on connecting with other homeschoolers, creating a positive learning environment, and never forget your own self-care.



"Putting-By" ~ Accessory Jewelry For Another Day

"Putting food by" has been described as an early 19th century way of saying Ingredients: to save something you don't have to use now, against a time when you will need it. Smaller households, limited storage space, and women working outside the home translates to less time and need for preserving food today. Yet busy people can still gain a measure of satisfaction in preserving small amounts of fresh vegetables and fruits for later use. If you're preserving foods today, you can choose to make refrigerator-pickled condiments that don't require any canning. Or you can use the hot water-bath canning method described in any book about

When you think of putting-by, think of pickles, relishes, and chutneys as jewelry that accessorize the main meal by complementing appetizers, spicy

foods, grilled foods, and sandwiches. Try preserving a few foods this fall, using old family recipes or some of this week's favorites from Cooking Corner. When snow flies, you'll be glad you took the time to preserve a few additive-free pickled condiments.

 $\label{lem:corn} Refrigerator\ Corn\ Relish$ This is a quick version of your grandmother's old-fashioned favorite, especially delicious on hot dogs and hamburgers. I'm sure you'll find other uses as well. **Ingredients:**

- 1/4 teaspoon Tabasco sauce
- 3/4 teaspoon mustard seeds
- 1/4 teaspoon celery seeds
- 21/4 teaspoons Kosher salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 11/2 cups white vinegar 5 percent acidity

- 1 each small red and green bell peppers, seeded and chopped 3 scallions, sliced
- 12 large ears of corn, cut from cob for about 8 cups of kernels

Combine spices, salt, sugar, and vinegar in a heavy, non-aluminum eightquart pot. Boil over medium heat, uncovered, for about five minutes. Meanwhile, combine the vegetables and distribute equally between four sterilized pint jars. Pour vinegar mixture over vegetables. Cover tightly and refrigerate; relish will keep refrigerated for up to one month of use.

Bread and Butter Pickles

This is the classic version of a condiment favorite that always shows up at picnics, reunion gatherings, backyard BBQs, and any table worth its salt! **Ingredients:**

5½ lbs. young pickling cucumbers, sliced into 1/4-inch rounds

- 8 medium onions, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup kosher or pickling salt
- 5 cups sugar
- 5 cups cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons mustard seed
- 1/2 teaspoon turmeric
- 1/2 teaspoon whole cloves
- 1 tablespoon celery seed

Combine cucumbers and onions with salt; let stand for three hours. Drain liquid well from cucumbers. In a large, non-aluminum kettle, combine drained cucumbers and onions with remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil and boil for two minutes. Transfer mixture to hot sterile jars; process in boiling hot water bath according to manufactures' directions for 10 minutes.

Dilly Beans

A nice addition to an antipasto platter or added to Bloody Mary drinks, these spicy pickled beans are a welcome condiment at almost any table. Makes four pints.

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs. green or yellow beans
- 1/4 cup pickling salt
- 2½ cups vinegar (white or cider)
- 21/2 cups water
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper, more or less to taste
- 4 cloves garlic
- 4 heads dill (or use 1/2 tablespoon dill seed per jar)

Trim ends from beans. Combine salt, vinegar and water in a large nonaluminum pot and bring to a boil. Pack beans lengthwise into sterile pint jars, leaving one quarter-inch headroom. (If beans are too long, cut them to fit the jar.) Divide cayenne pepper, garlic and dill evenly between four pint jars. Ladle hot liquid over beans, leaving one quarter-inch headspace. Remove air bubbles by wiggling a knife around inside the jar. Cap and process in hot water bath for 10 minutes, according to manufacturers' directions

Combine all ingredients in a saucepan. Bring canning, at online sites, or mixture to a boil; reduce to simmer and cook, simmering, for 40 to 45 minutes, stirring once. Mixture keeps refrigerated up to two weeks; it also freezes well for up to six months.

> Note: the reason pickling salt is used in pickling space. Remove air bubbles by wiggling a knife around inside the jar. Cap and process in hot water bath for 10 minutes, according to manufacturers' directions.



levels of government - the region or the state - but increasingly, it's other communities around the world struggling with similar challenges. Responsible localists look everywhere for solutions and insights." **Localism Means Respecting Differences**

Michael stated, "Localists appreciate that every community is different, with different values, ideas, and traditions. When appropriately empowered, every community will make different choices."


With these four principles in mind, what does localism look like in the Monadnock Region? It's much of what The Local Crowd Monadnock promotes year-round. It's individuals, businesses, and municipalities spending and investing more of their dollars at locally owned and independent businesses instead of chain stores, online giants, or Wall Street corporations. It's about supporting emerging entrepreneurs, seasoned business owners, and workers to ensure that all succeed. It looks like a community providing for everyone's basic needs, even in times of crisis. It's about celebrating and taking pride in where we live. It means taking care of the land, water, and other inhabitants in regenerative ways.

"Around the world are exciting examples of localism's success," shared Michael. "Communities increasingly able to feed themselves through greenhouses, vertical growing, and food sovereignty programs; urban organizations solving homelessness through tiny houses and community land trusts; cooperatives, non-profits, and B Corps removing the walls between managers and workers; neigh-

borhoods using cutting-edge technologies to be selfreliant in energy and water."

One local example of localism that comes to mind is the Southwest Region Planning Commission's (SWRPC) ADU Design Challenge. With an aging population, smaller family size, and high home prices, we need to pursue creative solutions to overcome our region's housing shortage. An Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU), a home built on the lot of an existing home, offers one solution where a homeowner becomes a home creator. An ADU can look like an apartment over a garage, a tiny house in your backyard, or any small dwelling on the same land as your single-family house.

happiness. It is a great place to make friends. If you are feeling lonely, go to a yoga class. Get there a few minutes early, and introduce yourself to someone. After your class, introduce yourself to someone else. You will find the most open and welcoming folks ever. The yoga community shares a saying, "health is wealth." We practice together, study together, share our stories, ask the key questions of life such as "Who am I?," and we always go home filled up with vitality and inner calm and ready to spread peace around us.

One more community is what I call the Big C Club. Anyone who has or has had cancer, which is most of us, is a member. As with any community, some folks are at the heart throb and some folks on the periphery, and others in the middle of the community. There are great support groups (community) in Keene for those living with cancer. For some, this kind of support is crucial to their cancer journey.




