artsy garden-related projects that I can accomplish indoors. These give me inspiration throughout the cold months and make me feel like I've got a head start on spring.

Before snow is on the ground, I'll go for a walk along the forest's edge and pull Bittersweet out by the roots. Cutting nice lengths of the twisty vines, I'll bundle them up and bring them home for projects. So as to not spread the invasive, I make sure to burn any extra roots or shoots I pull, as well as the berries. Once home, our daughter and I plop on the floor and begin to explore what these vines might want to be. Last year, she made a sweet little basket and I used the vines as a base for a wreath of dried flowers and pine cones. I've also seen someone twist the vines into a woman-like sculpture, letting the ends flow around the bottom of her like a large skirt. Pruners and gardener's wire can help, but aren't necessary. A good pair of scissors and baling twine will work.

Another tried and true project is painting ceramic pots. Anyone can be an artist and there's no shame in creating "unique" pieces. At home, we've painted flowers and suns, patterns of various shapes, and big smiley faces. The kids love this kind of project as much as I do. For a more lengthy endeavor, you could pick a theme - fruits and veggies, cartoon characters, holidays, or animal faces – and go for it! Even if my paintings come out wonky, I really enjoy the creative expression. Whatever type of paint I use, I have found it's best to put a layer of Mod Podge or varnish on top before putting them outdoors. You can fill them with easy-to-grow cat grass or just wait until the spring to use them.

Various vessels can work as pots, too. Old teacup collections, tin cans, or even random boots all look uplifting when filled with good soil and a perky, little plant. I love growing succulents because they are easily divided. One leaf stuck in the soil and watered regularly will become a whole new plant.

As we head toward winter, I like to plan ahead for Additionally, little Primroses will bloom through most of the winter and can be replaced with Johnny Jump-Ups come spring.

More homemade projects include making mosaic stepping stones or building a bug and bee house or a bird feeder. The simplest of all these is a feeder made from rolling a pine cone in peanut butter and bird seed. I love tying them in the kitchen garden, so I can see the birds nourish themselves while I wash dishes. Maybe it doesn't quite count as art; but it's close enough.



For inspiration beyond what is in my own brain, I turned toward my trusty garden magazines. Fine Gardening had a feature on Chanticleer Gardens near Philadelphia, PA. It turns out the gardeners find themselves quite busy through the winter, not only with routine maintenance to trails and trees, but also in the time they take to build garden structures and create garden art. These gardener artists weave, tie, or nail together branches to make trellises or upright tripods as focal points for the gardens. They hand-paint chairs and benches, not to mention do metalworking and make stained glass.

I don't think I'll set my sights that high; but, it's comforting to know that, from whimsical sculptures to a more practical trellis or even a tiny painted pot, there are plenty of garden art projects when the ice has settled.

I've seen it over the last seven years and friends who travel a lot share stories of how easy charging on the road is getting. How about the freedom to have AC electricity from your vehicle while on the road or camping or during a power outage? Many EVs have an outlet (Vehicle-to-load plug) to provide120 Volt AC power, some E trucks also provide 240 Volt AC.

A freedom some will appreciate more than others Maintenance savings start with EVs having 90 percent fewer moving parts to wear out. The electric motor is more reliable than the internal combustion engine, brakes last longer thanks to regenerative braking, which charges the battery while slowing the vehicle. There are no transmissions, exhausts, or oil changes to deal with either. Other than tires, I had no maintenance for the four years driving my first EV and for three years on this one.

A freedom we take for granted is clean air. Unfortunately, we overlook the toxic gasses from burning gasoline. Two of the most dangerous tailpipe gasses are carbon monoxide which is deadly in concentrations of about 400 PPM. The carbon dioxide (CO2) is making the planet hotter as a greenhouse gas trapping heat. For tens of thousands of years, atmospheric CO2 levels averaged 280 PPM. It has risen rapidly since the 1950s, now exceeding 425 ppm and rising steadily. Now talking of 'sure things' like death and taxes, we can add hotter temperatures



Attendees can tour the college's new dedicated precision optics lab, meet faculty, discover career prospects, and learn about financial aid options and how to apply for the program.

Keene State's one-of-a-kind program is supported by national and regional industry partners and federal funding, and is a direct response to a red-hot and vital market demand in the Monadnock Region.

A one-year pathway to degree completion is just part of all that there is to be excited about, said Dr. Sarah McGregor, director of the optics program and chair of the Physics Department at Keene State.

We're drawn to those who like to work with their hands, who want to understand how things fit together. The artist, the mechanic, the creator, all have a place here."

Precision optics companies are thrilled that Keene State has started this program, said Jim Kraly, the college's associate dean of academic programs. ²"The local industry network understands how important this type of education and training is to our region's future. Our partners are eager to host program interns and hire skilled certificate completers, and they are eager to show the range of fascinating careers the precision optics industry can offer."

Nine people are enrolled in the current short-


program model, which is designed to accommodate individuals who need to work part-time while pursuing their certificate.

Why Market Pullbacks In 2025 Have Been Shallow And Short

Market corrections often present chances to acquire quality assets at attractive valuations. Hence, low since April, but the duration has been short-lived. buy the dip" has long been a mantra for many investors. Historically, market pullbacks have offered attractive entry points for those willing to lean into volatility. However, following this April's trade policy induced correction, those opportunities have been scarce. In what's been characterized as a risk-on, high-beta market rally off the April lows, the brevity of such "dips" has stood out to investors and asset allocators. Here, we examine both the depth and duration of these dips.

Since the end of April, the largest dip the S&P 500 has offered was just 4.2% off its all-time highs. Said differently, starting May 1, if an investor wanted to get the most optimal buying opportunity off the most recent highs, and was able to time the market perfectly, they'd only receive a 4.2% discount. Not only that, but that 4.2% opportunity only materialized just recently, on November 7. If an investor had a buy limit order that was set to trigger at 5% below the last high, they'd still be holding cash.

Putting this into context, between 2020 and 2024, there were three occurrences of the S&P 500 being at least 10% below all-time highs. On average, during that time frame, when discount buying opportunities occurred, the average drawdown was 7.8%, but since April of this year that number has been 1.1%. So, if you were to pick days on which the market traded at a discount to the previous high, and through divine strokes of serendipity, happened to pick the lowest possible entry point on each of those days, you'd get just a 1.1% discount.

Not only has the depth of drawdowns been shal-New highs have been ubiquitous. The longest period during which the S&P 500 didn't register a new high was just 10 trading sessions (as of market close on November 11, 2025), with the average length of drawdowns being just over 3.5 days. Yet, between 2020 and 2024, there were 14 instances where it took at least 10 sessions for the market to re-capture previous highs, and the average length of drawdowns was over 15 days.



Why Pullbacks Have Been Scarce

Resilient economic data, resilient earnings, easing trade tensions, and abundant liquidity have fueled the almost relentless high-beta rally since "liberation day." Investor sentiment remains risk-on, and technical momentum has amplified gains, leaving little room for prolonged drawdowns. Ironically, retail investor psychology of "dip buyers" may be helping to shorten the dips. Fear of missing out on gains keeps retail buyers engaged, and the quick rebounds condition these investors to "buy immediately," shortening dips.

Conclusion

So, what can an investor do? The simple answer is to stay disciplined and remain invested with a thought-out approach to asset allocation. The pragmatists among us at this point would have concluded that minimal drawdown pain has meant attractive capital appreciation, if invested, which is exactly right. A regular investment regime may provide some dollar cost averaging opportunities and have a plan in place to execute a rebalance or asset allocation update when the opportunity arises.





Mashed Potatoes, Parsnips, And Caramelized Onions

Three favorites combined in a dish for six to eight. Ingredients:

- 3 tablespoons butter, divided
- 2 medium onions, halved and thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary or 2 tea-
- 6 parsnips, peeled and sliced
- 4 large russets potatoes, peeled and sliced 1 cup milk, heated (add a bit at a time until consis-

tency desired)

salt and freshly ground black pepper Melt 11/2 tablespoons butter in a heavy, large skillet

over medium-low heat. Add onions and sugar; cook until golden, stirring often, until nicely caramelized, 20 minutes. Add rosemary. Bring large pot of water to boil. Add parsnips and potatoes; boil until tender, about 20 minutes. Drain well, return to pot and mash. Add warm milk and remaining butter; mash until smooth. Stir in onion mixture; season to taste with salt and pepper. This dish can be made a day ahead and refrigerated. Rewarm over medium heat, stirring frequently and adding more milk if too dry.

Thanksgiving Stuffing

Sometimes simple is better and this versatile stuffing/dressing can be piled into a casserole dish and refrigerated for a day before baking. This makes enough to fill an 11- to 12-pound turkey if you prefer to cook it in the bird in your customary manner. I tend to think of stuffing as cooked inside the bird, and dressing as cooked in a casserole dish. Ingredients:

8 cups assorted dry bread, coarsely crumbled 3/4 pkg. frozen Jimmy Dean regular sausage, thawed

- 2 ribs celery, coarsely chopped 1 large shallot, coarsely chopped
- 3 large mushrooms, coarsely chopped
- 2 teaspoons Bell's poultry seasoning
- 2 large eggs

1/2 cup turkey broth, plus more for moistening stuffing later

Put coarsely crumbled bread in a bowl and set aside. In a large skillet, fry sausage until done; set aside to cool. In the same skillet, add butter to melt, casserole dish. then add chopped celery, shallot, mushrooms, and poultry seasoning. Add vegetables to the bowl of bread; add the cooled sausage and mix. In a separate bowl, whisk eggs with half a cup turkey broth, then add to bowl of stuffing. Mix to combine, adding additional turkey broth as needed to make stuffing as moist as desired. Bake stuffing/dressing in large casserole dish at 350 degrees for 45 to 55 minutes.

Cider-Roasted Vegetables

This dish bursts with flavor due to the trick of ducing the apple cider and white wine before using the mixture to coat and cook the vegetables. If you like, substitute beets for the sweet potatoes or make other switches as desired. Serves six to eight.

Ingredients: 3 cups apple cider or juice

1 cup semisweet white wine (like a Riesling)

2 tablespoons butter

11/4 lbs. each parsnips, carrots, sweet potatoes and red-skinned potatoes

salt and pepper

"Life does not move so fast," wrote Ralph Waldo Em- to three fourths hour; whisk in butter. Peel and cut vegetables into one half-inch pieces. Put vegetables in large roasting pan; pour apple cider mixture over vegetables and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Roast in preheated 425 degrees oven until vegetables are tender and golden in color, stirring occasionally and watching they don't burn, about 45 minutes.

Variation on a Green Bean Casserole

This tasty version of green beans omits the canned soup. It takes a bit longer to make but it can be made a few days ahead and refrigerated. When ready to bake, top with some canned onion rings if desired – after all, it is traditional at many holiday tables! Makes six to eight servings.

Ingredients:

1 small onion, minced

1/2 teaspoon dried thyme leaves

1 tablespoon fresh parsley, minced

2 tablespoons butter

1/4 teaspoon salt

freshly ground black pepper 1 tablespoon flour

1 tablespoon grated lemon zest

1 cup full-fat sour cream 1 (20-ounce) package frozen French green beans,

cooked per package directions; drained 1/2 cup sharp cheddar cheese, grated

1/2 cup bread crumbs or French fried onion rings, optional

In medium, heavy saucepan, over low heat, sauté onions, thyme and parsley in butter for five minutes. Blend in salt, pepper, flour and lemon zest. Add sour cream and cook on low for three minutes. Grease a medium/large casserole dish with butter; add cooked and drained beans to the dish. Pour sour cream mixture over beans; stir gently to coat. Sprinkle with grated cheese and bread crumbs, or the optional fried onion rings, over the top of the dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 30 minutes, until lightly browned.

Roasted Squash with Sage Crumbs

Sage tempers squash's sweetness in this simple dish.

Ingredients:

1 (3-5 lb.) Kabocha squash, halved crosswise and seeds discarded

soft butter for squash surface

salt and ground black pepper as desired 2 cups fresh bread crumbs

4 tablespoons melted butter

2 tablespoons chopped, fresh sage

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Rub each half of squash with some softened butter and season with salt and pepper. Put on baking sheet, cut side up, cover with foil and roast until tender, about one hour. Meanwhile, in a bowl combine bread crumbs, melted butter, chopped fresh sage and additional salt and pepper to taste. Uncover squash, divide mixture between halves, and roast until golden, 15 to 20 minutes more. Serves six to eight.

Yellow Squash Casserole

To change this up for an entree, use zucchini squash instead, and add one or two cups cooked, crumbled hamburg or sausage before pouring into

Ingredients:

1 cup mayonnaise

1 small onion, chopped

salt and pepper to taste

3/4 cup parmesan cheese, or substitute shredded Cheddar

2 large eggs, lightly beaten

2 lbs. yellow squash, cooked just till tender and well-drained Mix mayonnaise, onion, salt and pepper, cheese, and eggs. Add squash to mixture and stir gently.

Pour into a lightly greased one and a half quart casserole dish. For a topping: Mix one quarter cups each bread

crumbs and Ritz cracker crumbs with 1 tablespoon melted butter; sprinkle over casserole.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until nicely browned and set. Six servings.

nance. This is looking at our finances from a spiritual perspective - trying to align the use of money with our core values. Core values may be different from person to person. The course has been the impetus for me to do a bit of thinking on this topic. Maybe you too might gain a new perspective to think this way. Money is a taboo topic in our culture. We avoid talking about it. Let's ponder a few questions for a



Take two ideas: money or finance and spirituality. With these topics how would you describe them? What does money mean to you? What does spiritual mean to you? As you ponder, do they line up to be similar in feeling? Usually not. Would you consider your use of money to be a spiritual practice? Is finance an easy topic for you? Does it make you feel good? Spirituality – does this topic give you that feel-good quality? Does it uplift you? Does it give you meaning and purpose? Does your spiritual life align with your core values? And, what about money, does your use of money align with your core values?

What are your core values? Get to know who you are and align with what you feel to be meaningful and useful. Use your core values to guide you through life, especially with your use of money. Each time you spend money ask yourself, does this line up with my values?

Try this exercise: Take a certain amount of money in cash. Spend it according to what makes you feel happy and satisfied and has meaning.

Try this exercise: Imagine that you have just come into a million dollars. How would you spend it? Be specific. Think and ponder truly what you would do with this windfall. Would you spend it foolishly? Would you spend it for the greater good? Would you spend it responsibly? Would you give it away? Would you spend it on yourself? Would you spend it on others? Would you spend it on a dream of yours? The big question is: Would your plan to spend it align with who you are and your core values?

These are just ramblings of my mind that I wish to share as we move into the holiday season of gift giving. For me, and everyone is different, gift giving is an opportunity to share some of my core beliefs. For example, I feel that there is greater value in experiences than in material possessions. So I often give a gift card to a friend or family member with a gift of time on it. Let's go to a movie together. Let's go for an excursion to the beach for the day. Let's have a pedicure together and go to lunch. My treat since it is my gift. Also, dear to my heart, is giving to others in need. (I did not consider my children to be in that

Recently, I have taken a course on spiritual fi- category. They were/are surrounded by abundance.) When I first became a yoga teacher, I decided to give away 20 percent of anything I earned. I have kept to this for 30 years plus. Now I give away 100 percent of all that I earn. To encourage this idea for my children, on the Christmas tree each year I would put a card on the tree for Christmas morning with their name and a \$20 bill, or a \$50 bill as they got older. The instructions were to save it until they could give it away to someone or a cause to help others. I hope they got the message. That it is more satisfying to give than to receive.

I suggest to examine our financial spending as the year grows to a close. This includes bills, mortgages, food bills, heating, etc.


