



Free Fuel

Some of the techniques and contraptions I saw worked, others not so much. This instilled a sense of skepticism of new ideas and appreciation for the systems and projects that worked. Over the past few decades, I've enjoyed passive solar heating as the sun pours in on cold days and I don't need to burn fuel. Solar water heating has served up countless hot showers, though it's now rarely installed in northern climates due to cheaper and more efficient photovoltaics (PV) combined with heat pump water heaters. The that, beginning next year in much of the country and PV industry transitioned from satellite applications to uses here on earth in the 1980s, but struggled due to the high costs. As a semiconductor it has benefitted from great strides in innovations and scaling up. Today, PV is cheaper than many thought possible back in the 1980s, and is the most cost-effective new source of energy in most of the world.

For an apples-to-apples comparison of different energy costs, the levelized cost of electricity (LCOE) is the best tool. It measures the average total cost to build and operate a power plant over its lifetime divided by its total electricity output.

In the US for 2024, the LCOE for utility-scale solar PV was around \$46/MWh, and for onshore wind it was around \$40-\$50/MWh, though costs vary significantly depending on the source and whether subsidies are included. Without subsidies, solar PV costs have ranged from \$29 to \$92/MWh, and onshore wind from \$27 to \$73/MWh. The LCOE for natural gas was \$45 to \$208/MWh (Peaker plants are at the upper end) and coal was \$69 to \$168/MWh.

In 2024, the US added approximately 62.8 gigawatts of new utility-scale electricity-generating caand battery storage, which together accounted for vehicle (EV).

I was introduced to solar energy when I moved to 81% of the new additions, with solar making up the largest share. Other sources included wind and As I explored this desert world, I kept stumbling natural gas. In spite of this, the US is not leading in



Recently, the Australian government announced spreading to the rest by 2027, residents will get three free hours of electricity every afternoon. This Solar Sharer plan is possible because Australia has built so much solar power. Next, they need to balance this surplus of energy with electricity use, batteries, or other storage options to soak it up. This saves money by charging batteries during the day and then using that electricity during peak hours when electricity costs are higher. This approach benefits all ratepayers and the utility grid by lowering peak demand in the evening, which will save the utility system from the high costs of peak power supply.

Batteries are the key to resolving these times when free solar energy exceeds demand for electricity by storing it and then supplying it when demand peaks. Green Mountain Power is doing this in Vermont – showing how a balanced approach makes the grid stronger, while saving ratepayers money. Hopefully New Hampshire will see the light. After all, free, local fuel fits our state motto's value placed on independence and freedom. What are we waiting for?



Golden Rod Grange Hall Designated One Of "Seven To Save"

In the heart of Swanzey stands the Golden Rod Grange Hall, built in 1916, listed on the National Register of Historic Buildings, and once the center of community life for close to a century.

On October 2nd of this year, the NH Preservation Alliance designated the Grange Hall as one of the "Seven to Save" structures in the state. This designation raises awareness, draws resources, and ensures that one day the Grange Hall can serve the community. Although the building remains structurally intact, it has suffered decades of deferred maintenance. The Swanzey Preservation Society (SPS) hopes to see it restored as a community center.

The SPS is reviving events that involve community members. Every Wednesday from 9 to 11 a.m., Senior Coffee Connections offers conversation, breakfast treats, and presentations. The SPS served refreshments at Old Home Day, sold hot dogs to concert goers, and hosted a motorcycle tour. For more details, http://swanzeyps.wixsite.com//historyisthekey.

The building stands in the center of an historic area. When asked what the Grange Hall could be used for, residents suggested meeting space for town hall and non-profit organizations, town recreation department, coordination with Mt. Caesar Library for programming, performance space for local groups, scouts, summer camps, after-school programs, a visitor's center, emergency shelter space, training, and workshop space for the police, EMT, and fire departments.

A new roof was approved, and repairs, scraping and painting will take place in the spring. A much-needed repair to the foundation is the next project. The SPS needs help to preserve the Grange Hall. 
The Keene Cheshiremen Chorus





The Lantern Of Grief

symbolism of light in the darkness. These images shine with expressions of hope, guidance, renewal, restoration, rebirth.

The atmosphere of the holiday season is one of celebration and joy, warmth and good cheer. This is a time when family and friends and even strangers come together, sharing meals and gifts, when traditions and memories are brought alive.

For many people, this season can stir the pain of loneliness, loss, and grief in a very deep way. There is never an easy time to experience grief, but the winter holidays can be especially hard as we move through this time while carrying grief in our heart, mind, and body.

The painful sorrow of loss can sometimes leave us feeling lost in the wilderness, unsure of how to go forward with our living. We may feel as if there is no place for the suffering of grief during this time of light, and that we need to hide the hard emotions that arise in the holiday season, from ourselves and

The loss that brought such deep grief into my life the death of my son – often does feel like a dark forest. My experience of grief is a mysterious, richly textured territory that seems to stretch endlessly be-

The winter holidays are rich with the beautiful fore me. There are emotions and thoughts, some right before me and some hidden in the shadows, some tender that bring me a smile, some that are frightening to touch into and accept. As I move through the days of the holiday season, I miss him in ways that go far beyond words. But just as night and day live side by side, so does my sorrow live alongside the light in my life.



We often think of grief as darkness. But I sometimes like to reflect on it differently. Maybe within my experience of grief I can find the lantern that brings light to the path I am on. The loss is dark and painful, yes. And in an unexpected way, it is my grief itself that helps to light the way. Sometimes grief shines a light on my pain, on questions I do not have an answer to, on fears, on regrets. This is not at all easy to feel; but if I am gentle with myself, and have courage, and allow myself to be supported, I can bring loving kindness to the part of myself that feels these things. Breath by breath, the wounds are tended, and bit by bit, healing takes place. Some light comes into the darkness.

My grief inspires me to light a candle, to kindle the memory of a loving moment, to share a story about him with family and friends, to close my eyes and feel the ways I love him and treasure him, even though he is not here in person anymore. I have found that within my grief lives the light of enduring love. That light lives alongside the darkness of sorrow, the way stars shine in the night sky. 1 cup whipping cream

3/4 cup rum or bourbon (or 2 teaspoons rum extract Ingredients: if non-alcoholic version preferred)

The governing philosophy that makes Bernard's teaching of memoir so effective is that the struggle must be to nurture a healthy relationship with the past, in order to get beyond the authorized version

The central paradox of this kind of writing is that a memoirist must rely on memory, though, at best, memory is mutable and utterly fallible. Memoirists learn to honor artful leaps of dramatic presentation in order to create a narrative nimble enough to fully and convincingly reveal a life.

Retired judge, Patti Whalen, of Putney, VT, explains how the workshop has helped her process and eventually find a way into difficult material. "Pam's workshop is the highlight of my week," she said. "Pam leads each session with skill and warmth bringing the process of memoir writing alive with support and creativity. As I began to write and to identify the deeper themes, I realized with great relief that I had a way to shape hard truths into a story I could share. I could only have done this with Pam's caring but rigorous guidance, and within the supportive and generous community of writers she has created."
