Comedian Patton Oswalt Makes Stop At Colonial On His Effervescent Tour Friday, June 26th In Keene



Comedian Patton Oswalt will be making a stop at The Colonial Theatre in Keene while on his Effervescent Tour. Oswalt has spent three decades building one of the most celebrated careers in American comedy, moving between stand-up, film, television, and writing with a range and sharpness that has made him one of the genre’s most distinctive voices.

“Patton Oswalt has built a career on saying the things most people only think – and doing it with a sharpness and humanity that is genuinely rare,” says Keith Marks, executive director of The Colonial Theatre at 95 Main Street. “This is the kind of performer you see in a room like ours and remember for a long time. We’re proud to bring him to Keene.”

Oswalt has been nominated for six Grammys and four Emmys, won the Emmy for Outstanding Writing for a Variety Special for his comedy special *Talking for Clapping*, and earned a Grammy Award for the accompanying album. His most recent Netflix special, *We All Scream*, which also marked his directorial debut, earned him an additional Grammy nomination. His film *I Love My Dad* took home both the Grand Jury and Audience awards at the 2022 SXSW Film Festival.

On television, he is known for nine seasons as Spence on *The King of Queens*, his Critics Choice Award-winning role on *Parks and Recreation*, and memorable appearances on *Veep*, *A.P. Bio*, and *Seinfeld*.

Hands-On Workshops To Transform Lawns Into Edible Landscapes, Saturdays May 16th And 30th

Two hands-on workshops to transform lawns into edible landscapes will take place on Saturdays, May 16th and 30th from 10 a.m. to noon at 180 Hurricane Road in Keene.

Participants will learn and practice making permanent beds at the May 16th workshop, and polyculture and companion planting techniques, intercropping, and gardening guilds at the May 30th workshop.

These interactive learning workshops will combine education, live demonstrations, and hands-on practice in a welcoming community setting. They’ll begin with an introductory talk before participants head to the Gemmo Forest for live demonstrations and guided practice.

“Permaculture can feel intimidating at first, but these mornings are designed to show people that small, thoughtful changes can create beautiful, abundant landscapes,” says Lauren Hubele, director of Gemmo Forest. “We want people to leave feeling empowered to begin transforming their own yards into spaces that nourish both people and the planet.”

The workshops are part of the broader More Food Less Lawn initiative, which encourages residents to rethink traditional lawns and embrace more sustainable, food-producing landscapes.

Chase's Mill Offering Classes For Gardeners This Summer

Chase's Mill, the historic water-power mill located in East Alstead, is starting this year's season of events in May with classes to inspire gardeners.

"In addition to our usual array of craft and woodworking classes and water power tours, we're excited to include teaching heritage skills such as composting, using raised beds, sharpening garden tools, and knowledge of medicinal plants this summer," says Nancy Botkin, Chase's Mill board member. "These are skills that the com-

munity relied on 120 years ago when my great-grandparents moved here as part of a back-to-the land movement in the early 20th century. Not only are these practical skills, learning these skills is also another way to connect with the past."

Celeste Longacre, author of *Celeste's Garden of Delights*, will kick off the summer with a presentation based on her decades of experience growing and putting up her own produce on May 17th from 1 to 3 p.m.

On May 30th at 10 a.m., there will be a very special workshop in "Hugelkultur," an ancient European technique that mimics the decomposition of a forest floor to provide a highly productive, water-retaining garden.

"We've also got a workshop this summer that does a deep dive into composting – including looking through a microscope!" says Botkin, "thanks to composting pros Emily and Jacob Sherwood at Steppingstone Commons."

If readers are interested in plants, but don't necessarily want to raise them, in July herbalist Anne Fletcher will lead a "Midsummer Medicinal Plant Walk" to focus on identification of local plants that have traditional medicinal uses.

Head To The Woods

Locally, some of the best spring adventures can be found in the woods and are free. You could plan a list of places for the family to hike in the region. Some easier hikes in the area might include Pitcher Mountain in Stoddard, Little Monadnock Mountain via Rhododendron State Park in Fitzwilliam, Miller State Park using the Marion Davis Trail for an easier ascent, Skatutakee Mountain in Harrisville, Shieling Forest in Peterborough, or the two-mile loop of Harling and Hinkley Trails at Monadnock State Park.

Heading to the woods can also be a fun time for kids to make some discoveries. Create a nature scavenger hunt – find an acorn, a mushroom, lichen on a branch, a bee, a frog, and a bird's nest. At the same time, this scavenger hunt has your kids making observations and connecting with nature.

By The Sea

Spring is also a great time to head to the coast, when the beach is calmer and uncrowded. Bring a picnic lunch along to enjoy. Collect some cool shells, sea glass, or rocks. When you get back home, the kids can create a mosaic picture with their collection. Spring means the chance for some breezy days at the seacoast, so if headed that way, make sure to bring a kite along. Other active games could include throwing a Frisbee or playing volleyball, or for some chill time, a game of sand Pictionary – using a stick or your finger.

Paddling Local Waters

Your adventures could take you out onto calm

waters with the family for kayaking or canoeing. There will be plenty of wildlife to discover, and some of the ponds and lakes might even have little coves to explore. In the region, check out Gilmore Pond in Jaffrey, Lake Monomonac in Rindge, Silver Lake in Harrisville/Nelson, Edward MacDowell Lake in Peterborough, Nubanusit Lake in Nelson/Hancock, Surry Mountain Lake in Surry, Frost Pond in Dublin/Jaffrey, and Cunningham Pond in Peterborough.

Venturing Outside The Area

VINS Nature Center in Quechee, VT is an avian wildlife rehabilitation facility that offers live bird programs, bird enclosures for viewing, and – the coolest of all – a forest canopy walk to take an adventure through the treetops' perspective.

Amoskeag Fishways Learning and Visitors Center in Manchester offers educational programs, exhibits, live animals, and special events. In May and early June, visitors can view migrating fish through an underwater viewing window.

For a fun excursion, a couple of hours north of the Monadnock Region, take one of three scenic train rides offered by the Granite State Railway: Meredith, Weirs Beach, or Laconia. Visit <https://gsscenic.com/winnepesaukee-railway>.

In Holderness, Squam Lakes Natural Science Center is a great place for an all-day adventure with the kids. There's a three-quarter-mile trail that winds through meadows, forests, and marshes on a packed gravel path where the family can observe live animals on exhibit.

Getting Help With Your Native Yarden This Season



From WildOnes.org: "Native Plants, Natural Landscapes is a non-governmental, not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization with a mission to promote environmentally sound landscaping practices and preserve biodiversity... Wild Ones has 91 chapters and 29 'seedlings' (prospective chapters) across 34 states in the US to engage in environmental education and advocacy activities." While we don't yet have a chapter here in our region, their online resources and webinars offer a plethora of information. Some of their recent news titles include: *What is Wild & Why It Matters*, *Keystone Trees*, *Trees Are the Answer*, and *Thorns, Spines and Prickles*.
 PollinatorPathwaysNH.org We do have a chapter of this national organization. Subjects on the website include: 1. Restoring Habitat, One Yard at a Time; 2. Native Plants are the Key: You can do your part to help! Grow native plants and flowers, to help support our pollinators; and 3. Help Pollinators: We all play a part in the ecosystem of the world. Pollinators need us now more than ever. We can all make a difference if we do it one yard at a time. This website also offers resources, a newsletter, and events.

We've been waiting for such a long time for spring. Finally the sun is shining in between days of much needed rain. I bet your itch for gardening is turning, like many of us, into a full-on, excited, almost obsession. So, has reality sunk in yet? The endless questions that arise from actually planting a pollinator patch, an edible landscape, recreating a wildlife habitat, or shifting a lawn into a meadow. How much? Where? When? For how long? It's great to have a knowledgeable friend who can help answer questions. But if that's not an option, a bevy of nearly free online resources have exploded over the past several years.

They state the six straightforward ways that we can help pollinators (fun fact, they're not all gardening projects): mow high, stop using chemicals, plant native plants, use yellow bulbs, join their events, and water your bugs (you'll have to look this up!).

Native Nurseries Not Too Far Away

So, let's say that now you have an idea, a plan. You can buy native plants in Jaffrey at Fassettfarms.com. They carry perennials as well as woody shrubs and trees, and they have a crew to do installations – though I'm sure there is a waiting list. My favorite nursery is Nasami Farm in Whately, MA. They are the nativeplanttrust.org nursery – small with gorgeous, nearly mature, plants. Their photo exhibits for each plant with information are tremendously helpful. Lastly, there's IzelPlants.com for online native plant purchases.

Now, I grant you permission to start small, go slow, and understand that this native planting adventure takes years. A recent book, *Daily Creative: The 5-Minute Habit to Rewire Your Brain* by Blythe Harris and Mallory May posits the importance of creating a short daily creative practice. I suggest that five daily creative minutes each day be spent in your yarden. A bit of watering, a quick plant division, or even an attentive wandering with a cup of coffee imagining how each plant will progress. Deciding to spend creative time with your hands in the soil with native plants is a great investment in your health, your spirit, and your sanity.

A Potent Pre-Soak For Seeds

Getting seeds to germinate can be a challenge for gardeners. Sometimes they are too wet, sometimes too dry, and other times they get hit with “dampening off.” I have just learned an interesting way to help keep these seeds happy and strong. It is an overnight seed soak made up of three very common and extremely inexpensive components: willow tree bark, aspirin, and hydrogen peroxide.

The first thing to do is to collect 10 or 15 branches from the newest parts of a willow tree that you can find in the spring. Cut them into one-inch pieces and gently crush them. Put these into a jar of water and let it sit for 48 to 74 hours. Make sure that the water that you use is free of chlorine. If all you have is city water, fill a jar or pot with water the day before you want to use it and let it sit without a cover for about 24 hours. The chlorine will dissipate. Strain out the bark. This bark contains natural rooting hormones that stimulates growth and helps prevent damping off.

The next item is aspirin. It is important to get aspirin which is uncoated as the coating will prevent the helpful microorganisms from having access to it. Aspirin acts like a plant vaccine and is a powerful plant activator. It produces an acid which enters the plant’s cells and switches on its defense genes. This causes the plant’s immune system to activate. Most soils have bacteria, fungi, and molds which are just waiting for new seeds to attack. This gets the plant’s cells ready to win the fight. The aspirin causes slight stress which gets the plant ready for a bigger battle.

The last ingredient is hydrogen peroxide. It is important to use the 3% stuff that is common in drug stores. When seeds are dry, they go into a sleep mode.

The hydrogen peroxide will wake them up. The seeds are locked in a biochemical sleep by a hormone called abscisic acid. The peroxide breaks down this hold and triggers the production of gibberellic acid which is the hormone of germination. It also activates enzymes,

I don’t have a lot of experience with this seed soak, but I did soak a large number of pea seeds with it before I planted them. They came up looking incredibly strong and I am looking forward to the garden peas that they will bring. I am always disappointed when I buy store bought peas. They don’t have the sweetness of home grown varieties.

When the harvest is over, don’t pull these plants up by the roots. Peas, beans, and legumes have the ability to pull nitrogen out of the air. They do this with the nodules on their roots. As they decompose over the next year, the stored nitrogen will be able to feed whatever gets planted in their place.

particularly one called alpha amylase that breaks down the seed’s stored starches into usable sugars.

So the process begins with the willow water. It should have a tea-like color once it is ready. After straining, dilute it to one part willow water to four parts water. A gallon jug would be ideal. Then add one uncoated 325 mg aspirin and stir it in. Next, add one to two tablespoons of hydrogen peroxide and gently stir that in. The seeds should soak for 12 to 24 hours in this solution.

The Compromise

I was riding on the hull of a ship; my daughter was by my side. We were heading toward an area of red clouds surrounded by mist. I thought we were traveling through water, but not entirely sure. The hull seemed more torpedo shaped than ships I am familiar with. We were going to join our consciousness and force-of-mind with others to hopefully sway the outcome of this battle being fought with "consciousness as the weapon." Ultimately, we lost the battle, but not entirely. There was a compromise.

asked for greater understanding of healing. The answer came: that there was no magic shoe that would stop it, no physical fix. Surgery had caused permanent damage and I must live with the consequences. Just as in my experience in the red clouds.

However, I could train my consciousness to shift. Train myself to dial-up a higher frequency that would lift me free of the pain. I could embrace other ways of healing and being. I was being helped to do this. I felt for the pain in my foot and it was not there!

A peace had settled over me which I understood to be grace. I was seeing a dial which I was invited to turn to a frequency where I could transcend the pain. I was told it was simply a mechanism used to engage my consciousness, not literally there, but an action that would enable me to easily raise my frequency.

It works! I can operate without pain. This does not take the pain away, but I am not aware of it unless I purposely dive into it. I use this method several times a day and it is always accompanied by a sense of grace. I think it helps me to be in the world, but not so much of the world.

Getting To Know Lentils

A few people have commented on the recipes for dried beans that appeared last month in one of my columns. One said she'd like to get to know lentils better, another said they wanted to cook more dried beans for health reasons. I hope you enjoy sampling this week's lentil recipes.

Lentils may be thought of as a type of bean, although technically lentils and beans are cousins – both members of the legume family. A superfood, lentils are packed with plant-based protein (~9g per 1/2 cup cooked), fiber (~8g), iron, and folate, making them good for heart health and digestion. Lentils require no soaking, are fast-cooking (usually 20 to 30 minutes) and can be found in a variety of types and colors. Brown lentils are the common grocery store variety that work well for patties, burgers, soups and casseroles; green lentils keep their shape well after cooking so they are good for salads, casseroles and stews; yellow lentils break down quickly when cooked so are good for soups, spreads, and are popular in Indian curries; red lentils are mild and sweet, and, similar to yellow lentils, are also popular in Indian cuisine.

Lentil-Oat Granola

A nutritious bowl of granola, topped with milk or yogurt, is sure to get you perkling in the morning. Makes about one quart; adapted from *Easy Beans* by Jackie Freeman.

Ingredients:

- 2 cups cooked yellow or red lentils, cooked al dente like pasta (just barely done)
- 1 1/2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
- 1 cup almonds, sliced or slivered or other nuts
- 1 cup unsweetened coconut flakes or coconut chips
- 1 teaspoon ground cardamom (or substitute cinnamon)
- pinch Kosher salt
- 1/2 cup real maple syrup
- 1/4 cup coconut oil or canola oil
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees; line a baking sheet with parchment paper or silicone liner. In large bowl, combine cooked lentils, oats, almonds, coconut, cardamom, and salt. In a smaller bowl, combine maple syrup, coconut oil, and vanilla. Pour oil mixture over the lentil/oat mix, tossing well to combine and moisten it all well. Spread granola onto prepared pan, gently pressing it all into an even layer. Toast in oven 50 to 60 minutes until golden brown and dry when touched. Put on wire rack when done; cool before breaking into clusters. Store in airtight jar up to one week.

Curried Lentil Salad

Serve this pretty salad plain, with some cornbread or along with some grilled sausages or poultry. Makes four to five servings.

Ingredients:

For dressing:

- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- freshly ground black pepper
- 4 teaspoons curry powder, or to taste

Whisk dressing ingredients together in a bowl or shake in a jar with tight lid; set aside.

For salad:

- 1/2 lb. dried red lentils (others may be used, but these offer superior flavor and color)
- 1/2 cup currants
- 2 tablespoons small capers
- 1/2 to 3/4 cup minced red onion

Cook lentils in boiling water for 10 to 15 minutes or just until tender; rinse and drain well. In a bowl, combine lentils with dressing and refrigerate overnight. At least two hours before serving, add currants, capers and onions to lentil salad. May be served at room temperature or chilled.

Lentil Burgers

Make these fiber rich lentil burgers for dinner or stock your freezer. They're simple to make, packed with flavor, and taste delicious served warm on a salad or on a bun.

Ingredients:

- 2 onions, finely chopped or grated
- 2 carrots, finely chopped or grated
- 1 celery stalk, finely chopped or grated
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 cup dried brown lentils, cooked until tender (25-30 minutes.); drained
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander, optional
- 6 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
- flour for coating
- oil for frying

Sauté onion, carrot, and celery in olive oil in a large saucepan for 20 minutes, until soft and lightly browned; stir occasionally. Add garlic, lentils, coriander, parsley, and lemon juice. Mash by hand or puree roughly in a food processor or blender until mixture holds together. Season with salt and pepper. With floured hands, shape mixture into 10 to 12 flat burgers. Use a small spatula if necessary. Coat burgers with flour. Sauté burgers in a little oil until crisp and browned, turning carefully to cook the other side. Serve with watercress or tomato slices. Makes four to six servings.

Hearty Lentil-Sausage Soup

This soup is a winner any time of year. Vary the root vegetable if you like or use different kinds of sausages. Make this soup a day in advance and refrigerate it for added flavor the next day. And it freezes beautifully. Makes eight main-dish servings.

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. fresh pork sausage links or other sausage links of your choice
- 4 parsnips, cut into chunks
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 2 cups brown lentils
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon marjoram, or substitute oregano
- 10 cups hot water
- 1 can (16 oz.) tomatoes and juices
- 8 slices Italian bread, cut diagonally about 1-inch thick (toasted if desired)
- 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese

In covered five-quart Dutch oven our soup pot, cook sausage over medium heat in two or three tablespoons of water for five minutes. Remove cover and cook sausage until well browned, about 10 minutes, turning often. Drain sausage on paper towels, cut into chunks and set aside.

Pour off all but two tablespoons of drippings from pan; add parsnips, onions and garlic. Cook over medium heat about five minutes or until onion and garlic are tender, stirring occasionally. Stir in lentils, salt, marjoram and 10 cups of hot water; heat to boiling. Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer 30 minutes, until lentils are tender. Add tomatoes, with their liquid, and sausage chunks; cook until heated through. To serve: place a bread slice in each soup bowl. Spoon soup over bread and top with about two tablespoons cheese. If preferred, serve bread along side instead.
